The ideal district population, **39,202**, is based on the 2020 Census.
HD 4 has **39,415** people, which is **0.54%** from the ideal.
9.18% of the people in the district are new constituents.

- 47.05% of the district is American Indian and Alaskan Native, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 1.17% of the district is Asian, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 2.85% of the district is Black or African American, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 0.12% of the district is Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, alone or in combination with one or more other races.
- 43.88% of the district is non-Hispanic white.
- 5.4% of the district is some other race or ethnicity.
- 7.78% of the district is of Hispanic or Latino origin.

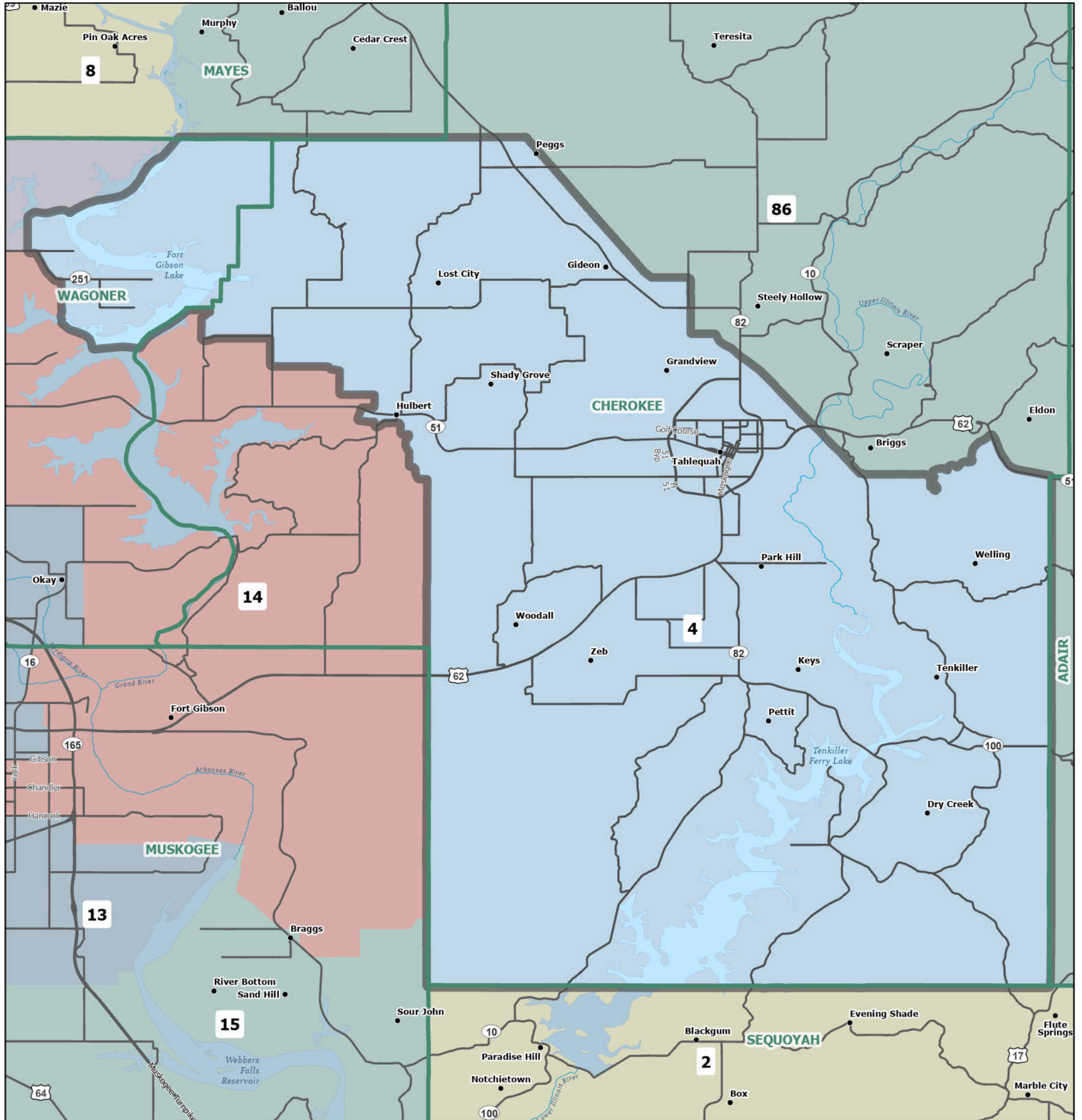

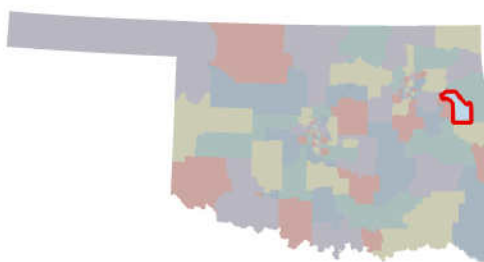
