MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 1401, 1526, 1548 and 1593**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 1401 – By Hall of the Senate and Wallace of the House.

An Act relating to income tax; amending Section 1, Chapter 340, O.S.L. 2022 (68 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 2357.105), which relates to credit for qualified economic development expenditures and qualified initial infrastructure expenditures; modifying definitions; eliminating certain credit limit; expanding authorization to assign certain unused credit; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 1526 – By Green of the Senate and Newton of the House.

An Act relating to forestry administration and enforcement; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Sections 16-2, 16-4, and 16-8, which relate to the Oklahoma Forestry Code; defining terms; modifying definitions; modifying duties of Forestry Division of Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry; modifying terms; prohibiting liability for certain activities; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Sections 16-21 and 16-28.2, which relate to forest fire prevention; modifying term; modifying prescribed notification area plan form; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1548 – By Alvord of the Senate and Newton of the House.

An Act relating to state department vehicle fleets; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 156, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 272, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 156), which relates to the purchase of vehicles with public funds; adding Department of Environmental Quality to certain list of exemptions; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1593 – By Daniels of the Senate and O'Donnell of the House.

An Act relating to probate procedure; amending 58 O.S. 2021, Sections 102 and 126, which relate to incompetent executors and administrators; modifying conditions for disqualification; making language gender neutral; and providing an effective date.
