President Pinnell recognized Nadine Lewis, Vice-Chairman of the Oklahoma Veterans Council, who led the Pledge of Allegiance.

President Pinnell addressed the Joint Session.

President Pinnell recognized President Pro Tempore Treat who addressed the Joint Session.

President Pinnell recognized Speaker McCall who addressed the Joint Session.

President Pinnell recognized Oklahoma Veterans Council Chairman, Pete Peterson, who conducted the Veterans Awareness Day Ceremony.

Chairman Peterson recognized Senator Stanley, Chairman of the Senate Veterans and Military Affairs Committee and Senator Hamilton, Vice-Chairman of the Senate Veterans and Military Affairs Committee who addressed the Joint Session.

Chairman Peterson recognized Representative West (Josh), Chairman of the House Veterans and Military Affairs Committee and Representative Cornwell, Vice-Chairman of the House Veterans and Military Affairs Committee who addressed the Joint Session.

Chairman Peterson introduced Vice-Chairman of the Oklahoma Veterans Council Awards Committee, Nadine Lewis, who presented the Senator of the Year award to Senator Pugh.
