Announcing the passage of **SBs 1232** and **2023**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 1232 – By Bergstrom of the Senate and Kendrix of the House.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1607, which relates to the Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology; extending sunset date; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 2023 – By Rader of the Senate and Pfeiffer of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Tax Commission; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 265, which relates to the Oklahoma Tax Commission and Office of Management and Enterprise Services Joint Computer Enhancement Fund; providing for expenditure from fund; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
