**MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE**

Announcing the passage of **SBs 1215, 1230, 1307** and **1527**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

**SB 1215** – By Stanley, Woods and Stephens of the Senate and West (Josh), Menz, Boles, Talley, Stark, Maynard and Hill of the House.

An Act relating to sales tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 1357, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 344, O.S.L. 2023 (68 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 1357), which relates to exemptions; eliminating deadline for certain registration for certain disabled veterans; updating statutory language; and declaring an emergency.

**SB 1230** – By Bergstrom of the Senate and Kendrix of the House.

An Act relating to amusements and sports; amending 3A O.S. 2021, Section 604.1, which relates to the Oklahoma State Athletic Commission; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**SB 1307** – By Stanley and Jett of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Sections 5-132 and 5-132.1, which relate to adult high school completion; removing reasons for which certain persons were unable to attend school; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; providing exemption from certain assessments for certain persons; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**SB 1527** – By Weaver, Treat and Stephens of the Senate and Sterling of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 10-105, which relates to school attendance; updating statutory language; directing a school district to excuse the absence of a child for the purpose of receiving certain therapy or other service related to an individualized education program; requiring submission of written request for excused absence; requiring documentation from provider; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
