MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 341** and **364**. The above measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 341 – By Frix of the Senate and Kerbs of the House.

An Act relating to the Railroad Revitalization Act; amending 66 O.S. 2021, Section 304, which relates to the powers and duties of the Department of Transportation; providing process for sale of certain lease-purchase properties; modifying process for sale of certain properties; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 364 – By Rader of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 13-116, which relates to use of corporal punishment on certain students; prohibiting use of corporal punishment on any student identified with certain disability; and removing language authorizing certain waiver.
