FIRST READING

The following were introduced and read for the first time:

HB 1001 – By Bashore.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; creating Lauria and Ashley's Law; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 13.1, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 151, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 13.1), which relates to required minimum prison sentences; adding criminal offense to list of crimes; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1002 – By Rosecrants.

An Act relating to stalking; amending Section 3, Chapter 318, O.S.L. 2022 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1173.1), which relates to procedures for serving Stalking Warning Letters; directing law enforcement agencies to provide certain notification to victims of stalking; specifying additional procedures for serving Stalking Warning Letters; authorizing service of Stalking Warning Letters after arresting the accused person; requiring entrance of Stalking Warning Letter onto national database; providing for the service of documents to the court clerk; directing court clerks to enter and publish certain information on the Oklahoma Supreme Court Network; amending 22 O.S. 2021, Section 60.2, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 305, O.S.L. 2023 (22 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 60.2), which relates to the Protection from Domestic Abuse Act; deleting requirement that victims file complaints with law enforcement prior to filing petitions for protective orders and related procedures; and providing an effective date.

HB 1003 – By Olsen.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1111, as last amended by Section 8, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024, and 1112 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1111), which relate to rape and age limitations for rape; modifying age limitations for certain prohibited acts; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1004 – By Olsen.

An Act relating to constitutional carry; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1272, which relates to the unlawful carry of weapons; modifying certain age requirement for transporting firearms in vehicles; expanding scope of persons authorized to transport firearms in vehicles; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1290.8, as amended by Section 4, Chapter 160, O.S.L. 2023, and 1290.9 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1290.8), which relate

to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act; expanding scope of persons authorized to carry concealed and unconcealed handguns; modifying eligibility requirements for handgun license applications; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1005 – By Olsen.

An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-114, which relates to proof of identity; modifying requirements; requiring creation of certain photo identification; directing collaboration with the Secretary of the State Election Board; clarifying applicability of requirements; permitting the Secretary of the State Election Board to promulgate rules; and providing an effective date.

HB 1006 – By Olsen.

An Act relating to schools; requiring display of Ten Commandments in public school classrooms; prescribing method for display; providing text of Ten Commandments; providing for acceptance of donated displays; permitting replacement of certain displays; directing school to donate unused displays; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1007 – By Olsen.

An Act relating to elections; declaring that an identification issued by an educational institution is not valid proof of identity to register to vote; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-114, which relates to proof of identity for voting; clarifying that an identification issued by an educational institution is not valid proof of identity to vote; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1008 – By Olsen.

An Act relating to abortion; amending Section 1, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2022 (63 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 1-731.4), which relates to prohibition of abortion; modifying definitions; modifying provisions related to abortion; prescribing standard based upon preservation of the life of a pregnant woman; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1009 – By Steagall.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2355, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 27, O.S.L. 2023, 1st Extraordinary Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2355), which relates to income taxation; providing for reduction of individual income tax rates; providing formula for income tax rate reductions; providing for reduction of corporate income tax rate; providing formula for income tax rate reductions; specifying income tax years for which reductions applicable; modifying references; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2355.1P-4, which relates to income tax imposed on certain business entities; providing for reduction of tax rates; and providing an effective date.

HB 1010 – By Jenkins.

An Act relating to elections; creating the Presidential Preference Primary Modernization Act of 2025; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 20-104, which relates to certification of candidates and delegate voting; directing the Secretary of the State Election Board to calculate certain costs related to the Presidential Preferential Primary ballot; directing the Secretary to issue an invoice for certain costs; requiring invoice to include detailed accounting; requiring payment by political party; establishing penalty; permitting appeal by the state central committee of a political party; establishing timeline; directing the State Election Board to conduct necessary hearings or reviews; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1011 – By Vancuren.

An Act relating to school employees; creating an Education Employee Assistance Program within the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; authorizing program to assist school districts in managing certain employees; permitting program to provide additional services; requiring program participation to be voluntary; allowing Department to contract with certain entities; directing Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services to promulgate rules and establish evaluation methods; construing provisions of section; subjecting existing programs to compliance with promulgated rules; mandating separate maintenance of program records; prescribing records to be confidential and subject to subpoena; providing exception for confidentiality; requiring participant to have access to his or her program records; construing provision related to school district's disciplinary authority; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1012 – By West (Josh).

An Act relating to privacy of computer data; enacting the Oklahoma Computer Data Privacy Act; defining terms; providing for applicability of act to certain businesses that collect consumers' personal information; providing exemptions; prescribing compliance with other laws and legal proceedings; requiring act to be liberally construed to align its effects with other laws relating to privacy and protection of personal information; providing for controlling effect of federal law; providing for construction in event of conflict with state law; providing for controlling effect of law which provides greatest privacy or protection to consumers; providing for preemption of local law; providing consumers right to request disclosure of certain information; providing consumers right to request deletion of certain information; providing consumers the right to request and receive a disclosure of personal information sold or disclosed; providing consumers right to opt in and out of the sale of personal information; making legislative findings; providing contracts or other agreements purporting to waive or limit a right, remedy or means of enforcement contrary to public policy; requiring businesses collecting consumer data information inform consumer of certain information collected; prescribing required content of disclosures; requiring consumer consent; requiring businesses to provide online privacy policy or a notice of policies; requiring businesses to designate and make available methods for submitting verifiable consumer request for certain information; requiring businesses receiving verifiable consumer requests reasonably verify identity of requesting consumer; requiring businesses disclose required information within a certain period; requiring businesses using de-identified information not re-identify or attempt to re-identify certain consumers; requiring permission; prohibiting discrimination against consumers for exercise of rights; authorizing businesses to offer financial incentives to consumers for collection, sale or disclosure of personal information; prohibiting division of single transactions; requiring employee training with respect to consumer inquiries; requiring disclosure of certain rights, requirements and information; providing civil penalties; authorizing Oklahoma Attorney General to take certain actions based on violations; authorizing Attorney General to recover reasonable expenses incurred in obtaining injunctive relief or civil penalties; directing Attorney General to deposit collected penalties in a dedicated account in the General Revenue Fund; providing certain immunities; providing protections to service providers; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1013 – By Vancuren.

An Act relating to education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-104, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 445, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 3-104), which relates

to the powers and duties of the State Board of Education; limiting the State Board of Education's authority to revoke or suspend licenses or certificates; requiring emergency to summarily revoke or suspend a license or certificate; requiring certain notice; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1014 – By Vancuren.

An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101.24, which relates to poor performance or conduct of teachers; exempting certain conduct from certain requirements; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1015 – By Vancuren.

An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101.23, which relates to the Teachers Due Process Act of 1990; authorizing certain temporary contracts for teachers with emergency or provisional certificates; updating citations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1016 – By McCane.

An Act relating to labor; providing definitions; requiring compensation for minors appearing in Internet content; requiring certain records be kept; requiring certain trust account be kept for minor; permitting civil action; permitting the Attorney General to enforce act; requiring content removal; providing age exception; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1017 – By Moore.

An Act relating to college sports; enacting the Oklahoma College Athletic Conference Act; providing legislative intent; defining terms; establishing the Oklahoma NCAA Division II Athletic Conference Exploration Commission; providing for membership; providing for chairperson; requiring certain study to be conducted by commission; requiring submission of report; authorizing commission to contract with independent consultants; authorizing commission to consult NCAA; requiring submission of final report; creating the Oklahoma NCAA Division II Athletic Conference Exploration Commission Revolving Fund; authorizing certain expenditures; requiring commission to explore certain funding sources; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1018 – By McCane.

An Act relating to health care; prohibiting unauthorized pelvic examinations; providing exceptions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1019 – By McCane.

An Act relating to public health; establishing the Oklahoma Rare Disease Advisory Council; stating purpose and activities of the Council; providing appointment procedures and membership requirements; requiring submission of certain annual report; specifying duration of membership terms; providing for filling of vacancies; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1020 – By McCane.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2603, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 274, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2603), which relates to eligibility requirements; providing eligibility for children of certain public school employees; defining term; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2605, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 274, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2605), which relates to student agreements; exempting students who are children of certain public school employees from financial qualification determination; defining term;

directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to verify certain employment status; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1021 – By Luttrell.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 12-609, which relates to required equipment for motorcycles; deleting limitation on the height of motorcycle handlebars; and providing an effective date.

HB 1022 – By Luttrell.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-403.1, which relates to failure to yield causing fatality or great bodily injury; requiring payment of fee for certain convictions; modifying fee; allowing discretion for fee payment for certain convictions; setting certain fee; directing deposit of funds; allowing court to impose certain additional penalties; and providing an effective date.

HB 1023 – By Bashore.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2104, as amended by Section 237, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2104), which relates to vehicle excise tax definition; modifying value definition; requiring certain information on bill of sale; requiring certain report; and providing an effective date.

HB 1024 – By Bashore.

An Act relating to Unfair Sales Act; amending 15 O.S. 2021, Section 598.2, which relates to Unfair Sales Act definitions; removing retail markup from certain definition; and providing an effective date.

HB 1025 – By Grego.

An Act relating to prisons and reformatories; creating the Oklahoma Department of Corrections Prison Rodeo Revolving Fund; making revolving fund continuing and not subject to fiscal year limitations; stating purpose of revolving fund; making expenditures subject to warrants; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1026 – By Hardin.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; making certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; defining terms; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1027 – By Kelley.

An Act relating to retirement; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Sections 2-300, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 361, O.S.L. 2024 (47 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2-300), 2-304, and 2-307.2, which relate to the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System; modifying term; updating references; updating purchase price calculation for service credit related to certain leaves of absence; and declaring an emergency.

HB 1028 – By Jenkins.

An Act relating to elections; creating the Oklahoma Election Process Integrity Act of 2025; requiring in-person access for all members of county election board; including certain employees and staff; clarifying official act; defining in-person access; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1029 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 396, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 32, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 396), which relates to the Oklahoma Funeral Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1030 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 199.2, which relates to the State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1031 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 52 O.S. 2021, Section 288.3, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 251, O.S.L. 2023 (52 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 288.3), which relates to the Oklahoma Energy Resources Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1032 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 481, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 283, O.S.L. 2024 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 481), which relates to the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1033 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 698.3, which relates to the State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 67 O.S. 2021, Section 305, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 2022 (67 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 305), which relates to the Archives and Records Commission; re-creating the Commission; and modifying the termination date.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 73 O.S. 2021, Section 83.1, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 91, O.S.L. 2022 (73 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 83.1), which relates to the Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission; re-creating the Commission; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1036 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1253, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 65, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1253), which relates to the State Board of Licensed Social Workers; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1037 – By Kendrix.

HB 1038 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-1923, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 197, O.S.L. 2023 (63 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1-1923), which relates to the Long-Term Care Facility Advisory Council; re-creating the Council; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1039 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 91, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 90, O.S.L. 2023 (63 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 91), which relates to the State Anatomical Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1040 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1354, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 66, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1354), which relates to the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1041 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 6001, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 89, O.S.L. 2023 (59 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 6001), which relates to the State Board of Behavioral Health Licensure; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1042 – By Kendrix.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-1001, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 91, O.S.L. 2023 (63 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2-1001), which relates to the Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying the termination date.

HB 1043 – By Jenkins.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; creating the Respect for Citizens Act of 2025; declaring certain driver licenses invalid in this state; providing details on invalid licenses; requiring law enforcement issue citation to certain drivers; requiring certain notice; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1044 – By Jenkins.

An Act relating to wind energy facilities; creating the Vital Industries Security Act of 2025; amending 17 O.S. 2021, Section 160.20, as amended by Section 21, Chapter 126, O.S.L. 2023 (17 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 160.20), which relates to setbacks; authorizing county commissions to make certain moratorium declaration; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1045 – By Dollens.

An Act relating to homeless persons; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-105.3, as last amended by Section 42, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (47 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 6-105.3), which relates to identification cards for Oklahoma residents; exempting homeless persons from replacement fee; defining term; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-325, which relates to fees for certified copies of records; exempting homeless persons from fee for certified copy of birth certificate; establishing requirements for exemption; defining term; and providing an effective date.

HB 1046 – By Dollens.

An Act relating to animals; creating the Oklahoma Spay and Neuter Grant Program; providing the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry will oversee the program; providing purpose of program; providing Department shall award grants based upon recommendation of the Spay and Neuter Grant Program Advisory Board; providing Board membership; prohibiting compensation for Board members; providing for travel expenses; providing role of Board; providing who may seek a grant; providing competitive grant proposal requirements; providing for review of competitive grant proposals; providing for promulgation of rules; making appropriations; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1047 – By Luttrell.

An Act relating to amusements and sports; amending 3A O.S. 2021, Sections 262 and 280, which relate to state-tribal gaming; providing exception; updating references; offering

Gaming Compact Supplement related to sports betting; defining term; authorizing fee related to tribal administration of the games; proscribing content of Gaming Compact Supplement; proscribing procedures for electing acceptance of supplements; providing for certain construction of supplements; allowing retention of funds by tribes in certain amounts; limiting scope of Gaming Compact Supplement; declaring certain conduct and participation lawful; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1048 – By Luttrell.

An Act relating to amusements and sports; enacting the Amusements and Sports Reform Act of 2025; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1049 – By Kelley.

An Act relating to Parents' Bill of Rights; enacting the Parents' Bill of Rights Act of 2025; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1050 – By Dollens.

An Act relating to local government; creating the Efficient Parking Act; providing definitions; prohibiting political subdivisions from imposing certain minimum parking requirements; clarifying applicability to disability parking; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 1051 – By Dollens.

An Act relating to cities and municipalities; creating the Fair Zoning Act of 2025; providing definitions; directing certain cities and municipalities to amend zoning ordinances and regulations; directing for zoning areas to not be exclusively designated for single-family housing; providing clarification; requiring comprehensive reports; providing report contents; requiring reports be made public; prohibiting certain restrictions; providing exceptions; clarifying that act does not apply to certain federal or state restrictions; granting the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission and the Oklahoma Housing Finance Agency enforcement power; permitting legal action; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to fire departments; amending 11 O.S. 2021, Section 29-102, which relates to activity reports from city fire departments; directing that reports utilize the National Emergency Response Information System; directing reports to be completed within forty-eight hours of incident; directing certain charitable organizations to submit reports utilizing the National Emergency Response Information System; providing report contents; requiring reports to be submitted within forty-eight hours of incident; amending 19 O.S. 2021, Section 901.7a, which relates to activity reports from fire protection districts; directing fire chief to utilize the National Emergency Response Information System; requiring reports be completed within forty-eight hours of incident; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to retirement; enacting the Retirement Reform Act of 2025; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to the State Board of Education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-101, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 182, O.S.L. 2023 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 3-101), which relates to board member appointments; changing the appointing authority for most members; establishing for-cause removal procedures; eliminating reference to service at the pleasure of the Governor; modifying vacancy procedures; vacating current members;

directing initial appointments; providing initial appointment terms; and declaring an emergency.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; creating the Oklahoma Revenue and Taxation Act of 2025; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

The Second Joint Session of the First Regular Session of the Sixtieth Legislature assembled in the House Chamber on Monday, February 3, 2025, and was called to order by Lieutenant Governor Matt Pinnell.

Senator Daniels moved that the attendance roll call of the Senate be considered the roll call of the Senate in Joint Session, which was the order.

Representative West (Josh) moved that the attendance roll call of the House be considered the roll call of the House in Joint Session, which was the order.

President Pinnell declared quorums of the Senate and House present and the Joint Session duly convened.

The invocation was given by Pastor Ronnie Wilson, House Chaplain.

Posting of the Colors was presented by Choctaw High School Air Force Junior ROTC.

Lieutenant Governor Pinnell introduced the Executive Branch and Statewide Officials.

Lieutenant Governor Pinnell introduced the Court Representatives.

COMMITTEE TO ESCORT GOVERNOR

Senator Daniels moved that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House appoint Members from the Senate and the House respectively as a Joint Committee to notify the Governor that the First Regular Session of the Sixtieth Oklahoma Legislature is assembled in Joint Session and ready to receive him and hear his message, which motion was declared adopted.

President Pinnell appointed Senators Jech, Rader, Stanley and Daniels.

Speaker Hilbert appointed Representatives Banning, Duel, Manger, Maynard, Roberts and West (Kevin).

Governor Stitt was escorted to the rostrum by the Joint Committee and presented to the Joint Session by Lieutenant Governor Pinnell where he delivered his message.

Upon motion of Representative West (Josh), the Joint Session was ordered dissolved at 1:35 p.m.

MOTION

Upon unanimous consent request of Representative West (Josh), the Governor's message was printed in full as follows:

State of the State

Lieutenant Governor Matt Pinnell. Speaker Kyle Hilbert and President Pro Tem Lonnie Paxton. Members of the 60th Legislature. Members of the Judiciary. Statewide elected officials. Tribal leaders. To my cabinet members – thank you for your service to our great state.

To my beautiful wife Sarah, who has inspired hope in Oklahomans across our state. And my mom and dad, thank you for being here today and for your support and love. To my children who are with us today, I know it was either go to school or go hear dad talk. Glad you're here today. And to my fellow Oklahomans. I'm so thankful to my Heavenly Father for letting me stand before you to deliver my 7th State of the State. I'm excited to make 2025 the best year in our state's history.

Some of you are new to this building. I'm looking forward to working with you on behalf of all four million Oklahomans. Many of you are seasoned veterans. We've gotten so much done in the last 6 years together. We built the largest savings account our state has ever seen. We passed the largest tax cut in state history. Our economy is the strongest it's ever been. We have become a top ten state for business. We are number four for GDP growth. We are number two in lowest cost of doing business. We are number eight in net migration to our state. We have 3,500 fewer kids in foster care than we did when I took office. The state of our state is the strongest it's ever been. And we are not done yet. Let's continue to build on this progress and make Oklahoma the very best state to live, to work, and to raise our families.

For those of us in this room, I want to remind you, we are here for such a time as this. We will face challenges, but we're stronger when we face them together as fellow Oklahomans and fellow Americans. I've thought a lot about what we've been called here to do – to build on the success of those who came before us, to steward what we have been given, and to dream about what's possible for our kids and grandkids. I believe we're here to pursue something greater than ourselves – something that will show the world what Oklahoma is all about. Winston Churchill said, "The price of greatness is responsibility." That means sacrificing now for future benefit. The reality is there is going to be pain either way – the pain of discipline now, or the pain of regret later. Many of us have witnessed that over the last 6 years.

In 2018, the state was facing massive budget deficits and we had nothing in savings. Over the next six years, we said no to good ideas in the moment so we could say yes to the well-being of future generations of Oklahomans. Because of that discipline, we got to come together as Republicans and Democrats to say yes to cutting the grocery tax last year. This

makes life more affordable for millions of Oklahomans across our state when inflation is crushing working families.

As we begin this new session, we will be faced with many "good" ideas. The greatness of our state depends on discipline and the willingness to set the right priorities, even when it's difficult.

In 2019, I said the Oklahoma turnaround starts right here, right now. And we've seen that turnaround happen. Let's not go back to 2018. I want to set a savings floor of \$4 billion dollars to ensure we can weather any financial storm. It's conservative policies like this that protect the American dream in Oklahoma. But what is the American dream? On its face, it's the ability to have a family, own a home, have a good job, and build the life you want. It springs from the belief that with hard work and resilience you can accomplish anything God puts on your heart. But the American Dream is not guaranteed. We have to have the courage to fight for it.

This past election signaled a shift in the way we think as a nation. More and more, Americans are moving away from the extremes and turning back to the values that have always defined our success: personal responsibility, resilience, family values, and hard work. Not DEI, government mandates, or regulations. Not extreme gender ideology, Green New Deals, or open borders. Americans voted for courage. They voted for freedom. They voted for the American Dream, not more government. We have a mandate to support and pass conservative, limited government legislation that makes the American Dream possible for all four million Oklahomans. In order to do that, we need to commit to these four principles that Oklahomans voted for.

We need to:

- 1 – Protect Oklahoma taxpayers
- 2 – Be the Best State for Business
- 3 – Safeguard our Savings
- 4 – Protect the Oklahoma Way of Life

These ideas aren't controversial, but they will require tough choices. They will require sacrifice. They will require that we trust that Oklahomans know how to spend their money better than the government can. That we trust that businesses want to make our state better for everyone by creating jobs and investing in their communities. That we say no to the good now so we can say yes to the great later. That we put our constituents over special interests at all costs. The price of greatness is responsibility. We need to ask ourselves: how big should government be?

States like Texas and Florida spend less per person than any other state. They also have no income tax. And you don't hear anyone complaining about their roads, schools or hospitals. States all around us – Nebraska, Missouri, Arkansas, Colorado and Louisiana – are cutting their income taxes and have lower rates than we do. If we don't act quickly, we are going to be left behind and we'll be considered a high tax state. So I'm calling for a half and a path – A half point cut to the individual and business income tax and a path to zero income tax. I like to remind the naysayers when we cut taxes, the money doesn't disappear. It simply stays in Oklahomans' pockets and gets reinvested in our economy. In times of excess revenue, Oklahomans should keep more of their hard-earned money. That is how we keep pace with our competition and protect Oklahoma taxpayers.

It's no secret. Left unrestrained, government will always grow and grow and grow. It's just like the lobbyist bar tabs at Broadway 10. President Trump and Elon Musk, through DOGE, will determine the economic trajectory of our nation. By cutting the size of the federal government, we can finally start having an honest conversation about our national

debt. If we continue on the path we're on, we'll be caught in a death spiral. Government is overspending and causing inflation to rise rapidly. To deflect the burden of rising costs, federal government expands benefits for more people. More people end up reliant on the government, resulting in more deficit spending. It's a great big cycle. And now, we're spending a quarter of our federal income – 25% – to make interest-only payments on our national debt. That's more than we spend on our national defense.

I was at Mar-a-Lago a few weeks ago and talked to President Trump about DOGE at the state level. I'm excited about the momentum, and we're going to build on it here in Oklahoma. Today, I'm launching DOGE-OK to keep the focus on flat budgets and limited government. For years, I've instructed my cabinet secretaries and agency directors to shrink employee count and cut unnecessary contracts. I am committed to having fewer state employees at the end of my term than when I took office in 2019. I also mandated an end to work from home policies for state employees to better serve the people of our state. Even still, we have public officials who have asked the Legislature to double the size of their budget. Our constituents voted for fiscal conservatism, not growing government.

If people hear one thing I say, it's that I want Oklahoma to be the best state for business. By being the best state for business, we're paving the way to be the best state for education, the best state for infrastructure, and the best state for families. Rising tides lift all boats. The world is taking notice of our efforts. This past year, a manufacturing company announced that it's going to invest \$620 million dollars in Oklahoma, bringing thousands of jobs and spurring more economic growth. Every day, people from around the world are chasing the American Dream all the way to places like Stillwater, Guymon, Madill and Inola. In just the last year, 274 businesses opened their doors or expanded their operations in our state. Entrepreneurs created over 31,000 new jobs, lifting up their communities and contributing to our state. This is not an accident. Here in Oklahoma, we have business friendly policies and the most affordable, reliable energy anywhere thanks to limited government, common sense, and clean burning natural gas. Because of that, our state has more opportunities than ever.

In my last State of the State, I said I wanted Oklahoma to be the high-tech data center capital of the world. That vision is becoming reality. Google continues to invest in its data center in Pryor, Oklahoma, and now it's one of its largest in the world. A few weeks ago, President Trump announced a \$20 billion dollar investment in data centers across the country – and Oklahoma is on that list. Those of us in this room know there is no better place than Oklahoma. This is a massive opportunity to create more jobs for people in our state and to continue to put us on the map as the best state for business. Let's keep building on our business friendly policies.

I've been vocal about getting business courts set up in Oklahoma. I saw court systems in other states playing politics with people's businesses. I wanted to make sure that never happens in Oklahoma. I'm grateful for the work Jon Echols and Secretary Jeff Starling have done to research and execute this idea. Let's get business courts finished this session, and make sure business disputes and complicated contracts will be handled by judges with business expertise. It's policies like this that make our state something to brag about.

In addition to our amazing business friendly policies, we have a wealth of natural resources to make our state the best place to do business. Oil and gas giants like Devon, Continental and ONEOK continue to grow their footprint here. Expand Energy made its home in Oklahoma City and is the largest natural gas producer in the nation. Our energy industry is a driving force in our economy, and when they are free from politically

motivated barriers and overregulation, they can power our nation and the world. That means more businesses can come online and more electricity can be generated in our state. I want to make 2025 the year of the Energy Abundance Agenda and continue to unleash Oklahoma's energy potential. So let's make sure we can build more generation on the meter and behind the meter to keep our energy the most affordable and reliable in the nation.

Because we're top ten for business, it's time for us to become top ten in education. When Oklahomans elected me, they elected a businessman with a fresh set of eyes to challenge the status quo. We had spent too many years settling for an education system that was failing our kids. So we ushered in the largest education freedom movement in the nation. And just recently, Oklahoma was ranked number four in the nation for education freedom. I believe that when you inject competition, everyone gets better, and we're seeing that here in our school systems. We passed open transfer in our state. Now, kids aren't trapped in failing neighborhood schools. Then, we passed a tax credit so money could follow the student. Now, thousands of kids can go to the school where they learn best and where they're best equipped to succeed.

We paved the way for the first ever religious charter school in the nation. I am so excited that the U.S. Supreme Court will hear this groundbreaking religious freedom case. After all, the government shouldn't stand in the way of a parent's right to educate their children in line with their values. But we also need to make sure kids are IN their classrooms. I've had parents from all over the state reach out to me with concerns about virtual school days. In some places in Oklahoma, kids are only required to be in their seats at school for 148 days a year. For comparison, Kansas students are in their seats for 186 days every year. We all know that kids learn best when they're in the classroom with our great teachers. It's just common sense. Pro Tem Paxton is already focused on this and I'm excited to work with him and Senator Thompson to make sure kids are in their seats ready to learn. Let's eliminate virtual days in our public schools.

If kids aren't leaving high school college ready or career ready, we haven't done our job. I want to sign a bill that creates more internships and apprenticeships. If we can get this right, we'll lead the nation in workforce development. Companies from all around the world will move operations to Oklahoma because it'll be clear that we have the strongest workforce anywhere. So I'm calling on businesses, schools, and universities to create 250 new apprenticeship and internship programs this year. Let's get it done.

Now that we've got kids in the right classroom, they need to be free from distractions. This past fall, I challenged schools to implement phone-free school policies. I want to brag on Rob Miller. He's here with us today. Thanks for being here Rob. He is the Superintendent of Bixby Public Schools. Through his years in education, he's noticed a clear decline in his students' attention and performance as cell phone use has increased in his schools. To him, the solution was clear. Kids learn better when they aren't distracted by cell phones and social media. He implemented a cell phone free policy in Bixby Public Schools, and he's seen a huge improvement in his students. I want to challenge the Legislature and school districts across the state to consider ways to make cell phone free schools a reality for all students. It doesn't have to cost anything – it just needs to be effective for the students we serve. Speaker Hilbert – I've enjoyed talking about this issue with you and I'm excited to get something across the finish line this session. I'm proud of how our schools took the cell phone free challenge to make sure our students succeed, but all of that means nothing, if our kids aren't safe in their communities.

Our greatest responsibility as leaders is to protect all four million Oklahomans. Americans made it clear – they want their President to defend our borders and protect our communities. I sent our National Guard troops to Texas to help secure the southern border. We vocally opposed sanctuary city policies and pushed for the deportation of criminals who were here illegally. I'm so excited to have a law and order President back in the White House that will listen to the American people and our calls for safe communities. On Day One in office, President Trump closed the border and made it clear that illegal immigration would no longer be tolerated. I launched Operation Guardian here in Oklahoma to help keep communities safe. I instructed Commissioner of Public Safety Tim Tipton and Department of Corrections Director Steve Harpe to be ready to assist the Trump administration as they begin deporting those who have committed crimes while here illegally. After all, the Oklahoma taxpayers shouldn't be paying millions of dollars a year to keep criminals incarcerated when they shouldn't be in our state to begin with.

But to have safe communities, we also have to have some common sense. Let me tell you a story about a man named John Standfill. John made some bad choices and spent 15 years in prison paying for them. He served his time, paid his debt to society, and now is helping give other people second chances at OSU's Oklahoma City Center for Social Innovation. However, he reportedly owes nearly \$30,000 in fines, fees and court costs. That's simply unacceptable. It's time to reform this system and get rid of what is essentially debtors' prison. We know that high fees keep people trapped in this cycle and contribute to higher recidivism. That doesn't make sense. I want to change that structure and make sure that a second chance is actually a second chance and get rid of fines, fees and court costs for good. John is here with us today. John, thank you for letting me share your story today. We've made so much progress together. Nearly 40,000 Oklahomans have received a second chance because of our efforts. We closed four prisons, saving Oklahoma taxpayers hundreds of millions of dollars. We are on a trajectory to top ten and we will continue to lead the nation in common sense criminal justice.

While I love telling people about our pro business policies, our great teachers, and our safe communities, at my core, I love to brag about how much we value faith and family in Oklahoma. I wanted to cement this priority, so I created the Office of Faith Based Initiatives. This office focuses on bringing the faith community and non-profit community together to solve problems that the government can't. Daniel and May Cave lived in Choctaw, OK and lost their home and belongings in a fall tornado. The Office of Faith Based Initiatives helped connect the Caves with Harrah Baptist Church which provided them with meals, childcare, clothing, and moving assistance. It was the perfect display of the Oklahoma Standard – neighbors walking with neighbors. I want Oklahoma to be the example for the rest of the country when it comes to connecting churches and non-profits to people in need. Daniel and May, thank you for being with us today.

The reality is that bills and press releases don't solve societal problems. The real work begins at home with strong mothers and strong fathers. For the past two years, I declared November "Family Month" and I encouraged Oklahomans to spend more intentional quality time together. I'm looking forward to celebrating Family Month every year because now, more than ever, we need to promote strong families. It is so clear that strong families are the drivers for success in nearly every area. I say it all the time – kids need their moms AND their dads. But right now, our nation is experiencing a crisis. A crisis of fatherlessness. The result? Less resilient families and less resilient children. At the end of 2022, nearly 250,000 Oklahoma children were living without a father in the home. Nationally, 71% of those who drop out of high school grew up without a present father.

66% of juveniles in state custody experienced fatherlessness. But here's the secret – we have the power to change this. The numbers don't lie. Kids with engaged fathers are 43% more likely to get As in school; twice as likely to go to college; and 80% less likely to spend time in jail. We can turn the statistics around, just by continuing to uplift families and promote marriages. That can start at the dinner table.

In my family, we've worked hard to make Friday night a sacred time for us to come together and share a meal. Sarah and I use this time to talk with our kids and catch up on their week. I challenge each of us to start with one extra meal. Studies have shown that sharing family meals results in improved school performance, better family relationships, improved nutrition and lower likelihood of future substance abuse. Let's take the opportunity to intentionally engage with our families. I remember growing up in Norman, Friday night was family night. After dinner, Mom would make popcorn, dad would turn on our favorite tv show, and we'd spend time together as a family. Mom and Dad, I'm so grateful for how you led our family. Thank you.

This is how we make the American Dream possible in Oklahoma. If we want a strong nation, we have to have strong communities. If we want to have strong communities, we have to have strong families. If we want to have strong families, we **MUST** have strong fathers. The health of our nation comes directly from having strong fathers in the home. That's why I have put such an emphasis on fatherhood programs in my time in office. But this isn't a policy idea or a funding request. It's a request for each for us in this room to take the responsibility to lead our families well. Our positions as elected leaders are not the most important positions we hold. Our roles as fathers and mothers and family members will do far more for the future of our society than the nameplate on our doors. There is no higher calling than to raise up kids to be strong men and women of God and to instill in them the values and ethics that are essential to the success of our nation. It takes courage to make the choice to be that present mother or father or grandparent.

The American Dream depends on families who are willing to step up and change the status quo. President Ronald Reagan said, "There is no institution more vital to our Nation's survival than the American family. Here the seeds of personal character are planted, the roots of public virtue first nourished. Through love and instruction, discipline, guidance and example, we learn from our mothers and fathers these values that will shape our private lives and our public citizenship." I want that to be our legacy – a state where the American Dream is alive and well because of strong families. Every generation has the same longing for the American Dream.

In the United States, where every state is a laboratory of democracy, we can see in real time which policies promote the American Dream, and which ones push it farther out of reach. I want Oklahoma to be known around the world as the state where businesses come because they know that they can operate freely without fear of gotcha bureaucrats or burdensome regulations. The state where parents have the freedom to educate their children in line with their values. The state where families flock because they know their kids can grow up in a safe, hopeful environment. The state where neighbors care for each other and there is always hope for tomorrow. Oklahoma is a haven. A shining city on a hill. And the American Dream is alive and well in Oklahoma. May God Bless you and may God continue to bless the great state of Oklahoma.
