Dear Governor Stitt,

Pursuant to 26 O.S. 12-119, I hereby irrevocably tender my resignation for the elected position of State Representative for District 35. Such resignation shall become effective on October 1, 2025.

My entire adult life I have been in public service, whether it has been in military deployments, law enforcement in Pawnee County, our schools as a teacher and coach or the representative of the people of House District 35. It has been an honor and a privilege every step of the way.

It is in the best interest of the people I serve in House District 35 and, most importantly, my family, to step down from my position. I take full responsibility for my actions and am getting counseling with my family. Although not an excuse for my actions, I am receiving intensive treatment for issues from my military service that I have long ignored as a problem. I am confident this will make me a better husband and father.

Over the next month, I will finish taking care of the remainder of my constituents' issues and will ensure my interim study on PTSD proceeds, where I am personally participating in a brain mapping study of veterans with a traumatic brain injury.

My office staff will continue to serve the constituents of House District 35 with any issues that arise until a special election can be held. Taking care of my family and my constituents are my top priorities.

I would like to thank my fellow House colleagues who have prayed for and supported me and my family during this incredibly difficult time.

Governor Stitt:

Well, this has been fun. I was first elected to the State House in 2016—just two years before you were elected governor. For a long time, I thought my service to state government would outlast yours. But plans change.

On Friday, November 7th 2025, I was elected to lead the Oklahoma AFL-CIO, an incredible organization that works to advance the causes of its union affiliates, organized labor, and working families across the state. It's an immense honor and a big responsibility to represent our membership as its President. It also requires me to directly lobby policymakers. As such, it would be unethical to take on this new role while continuing to serve as a legislator, so I have decided to step down from a job that I have loved doing for nearly a decade.

Being the state representative for the hardworking, incredibly decent people of District 92 has been the honor of a lifetime. I am proud of the work I've done on their behalf. I have enjoyed finding ways to work with my colleagues, whose views and principles vary in many ways from my own, but whose commitment to their constituents and to a better Oklahoma have brought us together at crucial moments.

I'd be remiss if I didn't acknowledge the occasional interactions I've had with you—whether it was our unfortunately heated exchange in the Capitol rotunda a few years ago, or our pleasant conversation about gardening and chicken-keeping during one of your visits to the House chamber. The best interaction we ever had, though, was during your ceremonial signing of the Hope Shaffer Act, legislation I sponsored on behalf of a couple in my district who tragically lost their daughter in a car accident. As long as we can look past partisanship in moments like that, I sincerely believe there is plenty of hope for government's capacity to do good. Thank you for your signature, and your kindness toward my constituents, on that day.

But enough with the sentimental stuff! In an effort to ensure that the people of District 92 have new representation in place as soon as possible, and pursuant to 26 O.S. 12-119, I hereby irrevocably tender my resignation for the elected position of State Representative for District 92 in the Oklahoma House of Representatives, effective Dec. 1st, 2025. It is my hope that you will not delay in setting a date for a special election so that the next Representative of District 92 may get to work quickly.

Speaker Hilbert declared the motion adopted having received a majority vote of those elected to and constituting the House of Representatives.

## **ROLL CALL**

With Representatives Clinton, Norwood and Timmons duly seated in the House, 95 members were present.

## **FIRST READING**

Speaker Hilbert announced the following were introduced and read for the first time.

### **HB 2929 – By Tedford.**

An Act relating to insurance; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 3639.1, which relates to cancellation, refusal to renew or increase premium of homeowner's insurance policy; prohibiting certain terminations; prohibiting certain actions by insurers for claims occurring more than five years before policy effective date or renewal; directing that insurers shall not refuse underwriting risk for homeowner's insurance in certain cases; prohibiting certain actions by insurers for certain claims; providing exceptions; directing that insurers may only consider at-fault motor vehicle claims history in provided time frame; and providing an effective date.

### **HB 2930 – By Tedford.**

An Act relating to insurance; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 942, which relates to motor vehicle insurance policies and when traffic record may be basis for rate changes or cancellation; modifying record requirements; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 943, which

relates to cancellation of motor vehicle insurance policy, increasing premium rates, or refusal to issue or renew policy; prohibiting certain actions after filing first claim; modifying hearing language; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2931** – By Tedford.

An Act relating to insurance; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 2025, which relates to the Oklahoma Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association coverage; increasing guarantee fund for annuities; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2932** – By Tedford.

An Act relating to damages; amending Section 10, Chapter 311, O.S.L. 2025 (23 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 61.3), which relates to economic and noneconomic loss compensation for bodily injury claims; establishing limitation on award; limiting recovery of bodily injury and property damage for failure to comply with mandatory liability insurance; establishing which party shall be held liable for court costs; clarifying act does not affect subrogation rights; clarifying claimant's insurer shall have rights to recover certain sums; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2933** – By Tedford.

An Act relating to insurance; directing that personal and commercial property insurers shall file certain report by specified date; providing manner in which report shall be filed; providing required content of report; clarifying that reports shall be treated as working papers and documents; permitting Insurance Commissioner to use reports to determine whether market conduct examination or investigation should be conducted; establishing penalty for violation; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 942, which relates to motor vehicle liability or collision policies; clarifying traffic records not to be used by insurers in modifying rates or determining refusal or renewal of a policy; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 943, which relates to circumstances insurers are prohibited from canceling, increasing rates, or refusing to issue or renew motor vehicle policies; prohibiting insurers from canceling, refusing to renew or terminate, or increasing policy premiums based on first claim against policy; clarifying circumstances under which policies may be canceled, not renewed or terminated, or premiums increased; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 961, which relates to premium discounts or rate reductions for resistance to tornado or other wind events; modifying circumstances under which insurance companies shall provide a premium discount or rate reduction; modifying citations; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 962, which relates to premium discount or rate reduction for resistance to tornado or other wind events for retrofit properties; modifying circumstances under which insurance companies shall provide a premium discount or rate reduction; modifying citations; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 1204, as amended by Section 16, Chapter 360, O.S.L. 2024 (36 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1204), which relates to unfair methods of competition and unfair or deceptive acts or practices; prohibiting insurers from conditioning coverage on the enforcement of certain laws related to structures damaged by a peril insured against; directing insurers providing certain additional coverage to consider all building codes as being strictly enforced; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 1250.4, which relates to claim files and responses to inquiries; modifying timeline for response to Insurance Commissioner inquiries; establishing that the Insurance Commissioner's dispute resolution program shall be subject to the laws and protections of the Dispute Resolution Act; establishing that only the policyholder may request mediation; making mediation voluntary except under listed circumstances; defining term ; requiring claims to be submitted and fully processed through the Insurance Department's consumer complaint program before qualifying for mediation; requiring all parties to negotiate in good faith; clarifying dispute is not required to be

resolved in mediation; providing procedure for rescinding settlement by policyholder; providing procedure for mediation conference; establishing when an insurer will be deemed to have failed to appear; establishing penalty for violation by insurer; permitting Insurance Commissioner rule-making authority; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 1250.6, which relates to property and casualty insurers, receipt of claims, and inquiries from the Insurance Commissioner; modifying timeline for insurers to acknowledge receipt of claim; requiring acknowledgement include Homeowner Claims Bill of Rights; requiring insurer to send detailed estimate where applicable; requiring insurers issuing a personal lines residential property insurance policy to include Homeowner Claims Bill of Rights; providing minimum statement of Homeowner Claims Bill of Rights; establishing violation shall be a violation of the Unfair Claims Settlement Practices Act; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 1250.7, which relates to denial or acceptance of claims by property and casualty insurer; modifying timeline for acceptance or denial of claim; requiring claimant be notified in writing; requiring insurer provide reasonable explanation of payment less than specified in insurer's detailed estimate; establishing interest rate for untimely payments; prohibiting the waiver of subsection; clarifying failure to comply does not form sole basis for private cause of action; prohibiting insurers from denying claims solely on use of video recordings or photographs using aerial imaging; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 3629, which relates to forms of proof of loss and offer of settlement or rejection of claim; permitting costs and attorney fees allowable to prevailing party except for residential or commercial property insurance policy suits; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 3639.1, which relates to personal residential insurance; prohibiting insurer from reducing coverage or refusing to issue or renew homeowner's policy based solely on use of aerial imaging; prohibiting insurers from reducing coverage or refusing to issue or renew homeowner's policy based solely on age of roof less than fifteen years old; requiring insurers to allow homeowners have a roof inspection; providing procedure for calculating roof's age; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2934** – By Tedford.

An Act relating to torts; defining terms; prohibiting civil liability for certain persons under specified circumstances; providing exception; clarifying applicability of certain immunity; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

**HB 2935** – By Gise.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 1357, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 391, O.S.L. 2025 (68 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1357), which relates to sales tax exemptions; modifying list of exemptions to include diapers; defining term; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**HB 2936** – By Olsen.

An Act relating to children; amending 10 O.S. 2021, Section 557.5, which relates to the Oklahoma Gestational Agreement Act; prohibiting person from being an intended parent to a gestational agreement if individual has been convicted of a crime against a child; amending 10 O.S. 2021, Section 7505-5.1, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 59, O.S.L. 2024 (10 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 7505-5.1), which relates to the Oklahoma Adoption Code; prohibiting placement of child in home if petitioners or any person residing in home of petitioners have been convicted of a crime against a child; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2937** – By Olsen.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1272, which relates to the unlawful carry of firearms; allowing for the carry of firearms on vessels; defining term; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2938** – By Olsen.

An Act relating to elections; prohibiting individuals with no intent to return to Oklahoma from voting in state or local elections; permitting individuals with no intent to return to Oklahoma to vote in national elections; prohibiting individuals with an indefinite intent to return to Oklahoma from voting in state or local elections; permitting individuals with an indefinite intent to return to Oklahoma to vote in national elections; prohibiting individuals who vote in another state or country's elections from voting in state or local elections; permitting individuals who vote in another state or country's elections to vote in national elections; providing exceptions for individuals and spouses employed by the federal government or state; clarifying act does not apply to individuals with intent to return to Oklahoma; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2939** – By Olsen.

An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-129.2, 26 O.S. 2021, Sections 14-105, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 292, O.S.L. 2022, 14-110.1, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 292, O.S.L. 2022, 14-118, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 317, O.S.L. 2025 (26 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 14-105, 14-110.1, and 14-118), 26 O.S. 2021, Section 14-144, 26 O.S. 2021, Section 14-151, which relate to use of facsimile devices in absentee voting; repealing use of facsimile devices in absentee voting processes; repealing 26 O.S. 2021, Section 14-118.1, which relates to transmittal of ballot by facsimile device; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2940** – By Olsen.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act; creating the First Amendment Open Meetings Protection Act; amending 25 O.S. 2021, Section 312, which relates to recording public meeting proceedings; clarifying that personal recordings shall not be prohibited unless they interfere with the public meeting; including the Legislature and legislative committee meetings in recording permissions; allowing monetary damages for unlawful prohibitions of recordings; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2941** – By Bashore.

An Act relating to fentanyl overdose and overdose reporting; requiring first responders to report drug overdose; requiring medical care before reporting; providing for immunity; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-401, as last amended by Section 13, Chapter 486, O.S.L. 2025 (63 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2-401), which relates to prohibited acts; providing rebuttable prima facie evidence that fentanyl was the proximate cause of death; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2942** – By Hildebrant.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; creating the Health Care Sharing Ministry Tax Parity Act; providing legislative findings; defining terms; providing for income tax deduction; providing procedure for claiming deduction; requiring Oklahoma Tax Commission to create forms and guidelines; providing funds to be nontaxable; providing Oklahoma Tax Commission with administrative oversight; providing penalties for fraudulent claims; providing for severability; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2943 – By Tedford.**

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Discovery Code; amending 12 O.S. 2021, Section 3226.1, which relates to abusive discovery; authorizing protective orders when parties seek deposition of high-ranking officers of a government entity or other public or private organizations; requiring party seeking protective order to meet certain burden; requiring court to issue protective order if burden is met; providing exception if party seeking deposition meets certain burden; permitting court to limit deposition if certain burden is not completely met; authorizing court to vacate or modify certain protective orders under certain circumstances; updating outline; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2944 – By Hall.**

An Act relating to the Strong Readers Act; creating the Oklahoma Reading Excellence through Accountability, Development, and Standards (READS) Act; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.508C, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 297, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1210.508C), which relates to reading assessments; requiring a Student Reading Proficiency Team to include certain coach, if assigned; removing language allowing certain students to demonstrate proficiency on certain screening instruments; requiring retention of certain third-grade students who do not meet certain grade-level targets on certain statewide assessment and do not qualify for certain exemption; directing certain performance levels to ensure students are meeting certain criteria; requiring school districts to include certain information in annual report; providing good-cause exemptions for promotion of certain students; providing process for evaluation of good-cause exemption requests; directing certain intervention services to be provided to certain students subject to retention; allowing a school district to provide an intensive acceleration class for retained third-grade students; requiring the State Department of Education to employ literacy coaches; providing qualifications for literacy coach; providing for assignment and duties of literacy coaches; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.508D, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 411, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1210.508D), which relates to Strong Readers Act funding; directing allocation for certain retained students; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.508E, as amended by Section 7, Chapter 411, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1210.508E), which relates to summer academies; updating statutory language; requiring, rather than allowing, a teacher to recommend a summer academy for students in certain grades; requiring school districts beginning in certain summer to provide a summer academy or other program to certain students; requiring administration of certain alternative assessment by certain date; providing for promotion of students who attend certain academy or other program; requiring school districts to notify the State Department of Education by certain date regarding offering of summer academy or other program; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**HB 2945 – By Olsen.**

An Act relating to abortion-inducing drugs; creating the Protecting Moms and Babies Act; defining terms; providing exclusions to whom a lawsuit can be brought against; prohibiting the manufacturing or distributing of abortion-inducing drugs; prohibiting mailing, transporting, delivering, prescribing, or providing an abortion-inducing drug; providing for certain exceptions to the prohibition; providing for only qui tam actions; providing qui tam enforcement of prohibitions relating to abortion-inducing drugs; establishing defenses; establishing what are not defenses; establishing a statute of limitation; providing remedies for a qui tam judgment; disallowing coordinated enforcement; providing for personal jurisdiction and applicability of state law; providing

for jurisdiction of appeals; prohibiting application of other state's law; providing protections from certain counteractions; providing a severability clause; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 2946** – By Gise.

An Act relating to postsecondary education; creating the Sergeant Bobby Swartz Act; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3218.7-1, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 382, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 3218.7-1), which relates to waiver of certain higher education fees and costs for children of persons killed in line of duty; expanding waiver to certain grandchildren; amending Section 3, Chapter 382, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 14-134.1), which relates to waiver of career and technology education fees for children of persons killed in line of duty; expanding waiver to grandchildren; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**HB 2947** – By Grego.

President Pinnell declared quorums of the Senate and House present and the Joint Session duly convened.

The invocation was given by Pastor Ronnie Wilson, House Chaplain.

Posting of the Colors was presented by Choctaw High School Air Force Junior ROTC.

## COMMITTEE TO ESCORT GOVERNOR

Senator Daniels moved that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House appoint Members from the Senate and the House respectively as a Joint Committee to notify the Governor that the Second Regular Session of the Sixtieth Oklahoma Legislature

is assembled in Joint Session and ready to receive him and hear his message, which motion was declared adopted.

President Pinnell appointed Senators Howard, Weaver, Pugh, Hamilton.

Speaker Hilbert appointed Representatives Pfeiffer, Caldwell (Chad), Lepak, Kannady, Luttrell.

Governor Stitt was escorted to the rostrum by the Joint Committee and presented to the Joint Session by Lieutenant Governor Pinnell where he delivered his message.

Upon motion of Representative West (Josh), the Joint Session was ordered dissolved at 1:25 p.m.

### **Speaker Pro Tempore Moore Presiding**

#### **MOTION**

Representative West (Josh) moved that the State of the State Message of the Governor be printed in full in the House Journal, which motion was declared adopted.

#### **STATE OF THE STATE**

Lieutenant Governor Matt Pinnell – It's been great to serve alongside you for the last 7 years. Speaker Kyle Hilbert and President Pro Tem Lonnie Paxton – thank you for your leadership in this building. It's an honor to serve with you. Members of the 60th Legislature and statewide elected officials – I'm looking forward to working with each of you this session. Members of the Judiciary – thank you for being here today.

To my cabinet members – thank you for everything you do for Oklahoma. I want to extend a special thank you to those of you who have served since the beginning, Secretary Blayne Arthur and Secretary Tim Gatz. Your dedication to the State of Oklahoma and the people we serve will continue to pay dividends for generations to come. Thank you.

To my boomerang team – David Ostrowe, Donelle Harder, and John Budd – we started together in 2019. Thank you for returning to state service to help me complete Oklahoma's turnaround.

How about the world champions - the Oklahoma City Thunder, a team that embodies the true spirit of Oklahoma. I'm excited to have Will Syring and Dan Mahoney from the Thunder Executive team here with me today.

To my mom and dad, thank you for being here today. Your prayers and support have been invaluable throughout my life. I'm so grateful for you. To my children – being your dad is the greatest job in the world. Thank you for the sacrifices you have made so that I could serve our state. I did it so you and your fellow Oklahomans can chase your American Dream.

To the most beautiful and elegant First Lady in the nation – You've kept our family strong, you've been a constant source of wisdom and prayer, and you've been my steadfast partner throughout our marriage. Thank you and I love you. I thank God for this

opportunity to stand before you today. As King Solomon prayed for wisdom, that's been my prayer and will continue to be for this last session and for those who come after me.

And to my fellow Oklahomans. It has been one of the greatest honors of my life to serve as your Governor. It's amazing to see all we have accomplished together over the last 7 years. The state of our state is the strongest it's ever been. And ladies and gentlemen, we're not done yet. When I first addressed this chamber in 2019, before I had any idea what challenges awaited us, I promised a turnaround for our state. I cast a clear vision for Oklahoma: To be a top ten state.

But to understand where Oklahoma is going, it helps to remember how America even came to be. And in our 250th year as a nation, we reflect on that story. Our story is one built on gritty ambition. It's a story where nothing was given, but everything is possible – where your future could be determined not by the circumstances of your birth, instead, by what you are willing to work hard to build. That spirit, the belief that opportunity is earned – not inherited – and that you can achieve anything you set your mind to, is the heartbeat of the United States of America. Oklahoma is not just part of this American Dream. We are its purest expression. And this spirit is what has always defined Oklahoma. Oklahoma is where bold dreams are possible.

I believe these last seven years have been the greatest in state history. We've gone from budget deficits to historic savings. We increased public education funding more in my term as Governor than in the past 25 years combined. At the same time, we've cut taxes by \$1.6 billion dollars and let Oklahomans keep more of their money. We diversified our economy, maintaining one of the lowest unemployment rates in the nation. We've seen median income increase by nearly \$11,000. While other states were locking down during COVID, forcing vaccine mandates or letting boys play in girls' sports, we protected individual liberties and religious freedom. We gave Oklahomans a true second chance, shrinking our prison population by 25% while maintaining record low recidivism. We've shown the nation why Oklahoma is the best place to pursue the American Dream. Now, as we enter this session, let's keep this momentum going by uniting around three principles: reduce regulation, protect the vulnerable, and secure our state's future.

In 2019, with no money in reserve, I insisted that we limit our spending and build up our savings account. I slammed the brakes on spending every dime we were authorized. That approach protected Oklahoma so we could make capital improvements without growing headcount. True sustainable budgeting demands discipline. Let's work together this year to ensure we don't go back to the financial mess we inherited in 2019.

Recent federal shutdowns and a \$38 trillion dollar federal debt show us that the federal government isn't a reliable partner. It's essential that we maintain a conservative financial position. Let's be cautious with unfunded mandates, new agencies and new programs.

There will be over 6200 bills considered this session. Every bill will come with a tradeoff, and those often come in the form of spending more money. Over the years, I've vetoed multiple spending bills that have added to our recurring expenses, yet many of those vetoes were overridden. Tallying it all up, veto overrides of spending bills have cost the taxpayers nearly \$800 million in my time as Governor. That's enough to cut nearly another point off the income tax. We have to stand up for the taxpayer and advocate for the future of our state. A government program rarely fixes a societal problem. But it sure makes some lobbyists rich. Like Ronald Reagan said, you eventually run out of other peoples' money.

Last year, with your partnership, we delivered one of our greatest budget reform wins in history: the Path to Zero income tax – effectively capping spending in statute to protect taxpayers. To preserve this progress, I'm calling for a State Question on the ballot. Let's

codify a 3% annual cap on recurring spending growth in our Constitution and lock in future cuts with ironclad rules. This keeps the growth of government in check and protects the Oklahoma taxpayers.

And where I have authority, I'll rein in welfare spending. Government dependency is a trap. It robs self-reliance and balloons budgets. I always say government programs should be a trampoline, not a hammock, but too often that is not the case. Medicaid is Exhibit A – driving massive spending growth while enabling waste. In 10 years, Medicaid is projected to eat up 37% of our annual budget - \$6 billion dollars. We have to make a change. My recent executive order ramps up work requirements and vetting for Medicaid, SNAP and other federal welfare benefits. But I need your help. I'm calling on the Legislature to send a question to voters that would allow adjustments to Medicaid expansion so that we protect the program for those who really need it, not those who should be working.

When I ran for office, I promised Oklahoma a \$2 billion savings account – no one believed we could do it. The newspapers ran headlines challenging the idea. Today, with your partnership, we've shattered records, holding the largest cash reserves in state history—over \$5.5 billion dollars at its peak. Today, I call on this Legislature to create the Taxpayer Endowment Fund—seeding it with \$750 million dollars of existing savings. Let's imagine what's possible - \$750 million invested today can turn into \$3.2 billion in just 20 years, generating sustainable revenue every year. Proven sovereign wealth funds in red states like Wyoming, Alaska, and Texas are already doing this successfully. Let's lock in these gains and let them grow for the future.

Last week, 1000 Oklahomans were born. One of them is very special to me, my first grandson. I know, I don't look old enough to be a grandpa. These new Oklahomans are the reason we're all here. President Trump is championing a pathway to secure the American Dream for the next generation. Now, through the Trump Accounts, when a child turns 18, they have a launchpad to buy a home or start a business or to go to college. And now, thanks to incredible private sector leadership, momentum is building nationwide. Michael Dell, the founder and CEO of Dell Technologies, an American Dream story himself, has stepped up with a \$6.25 billion investment in those accounts.

Oklahoma is the epicenter of the American Dream, and we can and should invest in these accounts for every Oklahoma kid born this year. If we RE-appropriate \$12 million dollars of existing funds, we can add \$250 dollars to every Oklahoma kid's account this year. But let's not stop there. I invite our great Oklahoma businesses to be part of this movement. I've already spoken to Williams and Continental who are looking at ways they can contribute and invest in the children of their employees. Chad Zamarin, CEO of Williams is here with us today. Thank you Chad for championing the next generation of Oklahomans and for everything you do for the oil & gas industry. Together, we're not just talking about the American Dream, we're securing it for the next generation.

For the past seven years, as I've travelled around Oklahoma, I've learned what the American Dream means to us. Oklahomans aren't waiting for the American Dream, they're building it for themselves. It's the freedom to start a business or nonprofit. For others, it's the freedom to buy a home. For nearly 250 years, the American Dream has been rooted in the promise of home ownership, a place to raise a family, build a future, and pass something on to the next generation. Here in Oklahoma, that dream runs deep. Our forefathers chased opportunity in the Land Run of 1889, staking claims on unassigned lands and building communities from the ground up. This chamber sits on top of that history. We are the heirs of their American Dream.

Like in 1889, Oklahoma is once again attracting new pioneers. Because of our commitment to limited government and protecting the Oklahoma way of life, our state is the best in the country. And for the third straight year, Oklahoma is top ten for people moving into our state. We are headed in the right direction, and the world is taking notice. More businesses, more people, more demand for housing...which means higher property values. As our property values rise, so do property taxes. And too many Oklahomans – veterans, seniors, and young families – are feeling the pressure. Many are concerned they're being priced out of the American Dream. We owe Oklahomans real relief, not temporary fixes and election-cycle talking points. We can't lose the momentum of this moment. I'm calling for a state question that freezes property tax growth across the board. Send it to the people.

For some, the American dream might look like a home, but it starts with a strong education. We know that when you're young, you learn to read, then as you get older, you read to learn. No career pathway program, no workforce initiative, no intervention later in school can succeed if students cannot read well. And too many of our students are not reading at grade level. But let's be honest with ourselves. This challenge isn't new—and it isn't limited to early literacy. Oklahoma's public schools have lagged in outcomes for some time, holding our state back. It's not because our teachers are less dedicated. It's not because our students are less capable. And it's not because we haven't spent enough money. It's because the system itself was flawed.

For decades, students were assigned to schools based solely on their zip code—meaning by where their parents could afford to buy a home. Those schools were highly regulated, government-run, and built around a one-size-fits-all model. Schools didn't need to compete. That's how our system was. So we injected competition into the system.

First we passed open transfer so kids could get out of a failing school district. I want to shout out Norman public schools for accepting open transfer with open arms. They've remained number one year after year for accepting new students into their district. In the Blue Room of the Capitol, there's a group of Norman High students listening right now. As a graduate of Norman High School, thanks for being here guys! Go Tigers!

At the end of it all, a student can transfer to a new school, but if they want to excel in athletics, their opportunity may be blocked by an unelected and unaccountable High School sports association, the OSSAA. Last year, we heard stories of students who followed the rules and did everything right to transfer schools. And yet the Oklahoma Secondary School Activities Association (OSSAA) denied them the chance to play basketball at their new school. Their parents had to hire a lawyer and go to court just to get to play at their new school. That is unacceptable. Your ability to play sports shouldn't be contingent on your parent's ability to afford an attorney. It's time to eliminate the OSSAA and secure our progress with open transfer.

Next, we expanded access to charter schools. Our statewide charter board was a great reform, but we still let local school districts block new charters from opening. You shouldn't have to get permission from McDonald's to open a Burger King across the street. If we want top-tier charters to come to Oklahoma, they should be able to go straight to the statewide board for authorization instead of having to play "mother may I" with local school districts.

Finally, we passed the most impactful education reform in our history, The Parental Choice Tax Credit! To finish the work on this achievement, it's time to make the program available to every Oklahoma family who wants it. Let's eliminate the cap. Let the money follow the student. Put parents in charge. Encourage competition and excellence.

This past year has been a turnaround year at the Oklahoma State Department of Education. I'm proud to have appointed Lindel Fields, who is leading that effort. He's brought a much-needed culture change to our state. Oklahoma has always elected its State Superintendent. Every four years, a new candidate runs for that office, promising parents a new solution—more programs, more money, more accountability, more flexibility. On and on. Is the problem really that we haven't yet found the magic policy idea? Or is it that we have a politics problem? Thirty-eight states appoint their superintendent rather than electing them. It keeps the focus on outcomes instead of politics. Leadership alignment matters. That's why Oklahoma's next Governor should have the authority to appoint the Superintendent of Public Instruction. I'm grateful to Speaker Hilbert and President Pro Tem Paxton for their leadership on this issue. It's common sense. Let's get it done this year.

As Governor, my top priority has always been keeping Oklahomans safe. One of the greatest threats to public safety is the out-of-control marijuana industry. When Oklahomans voted to legalize medical marijuana in 2018, we were sold a bill of goods. Out of state liberal activists preyed on the compassionate nature of Oklahomans. Then, it opened up Pandora's box. Now, we have more dispensaries than we do pharmacies. Think about that...These storefronts hide an industry that enables cartel activity, human trafficking, and foreign influence in our state. Adria Berry at Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority and Donnie Anderson at Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics have done incredible work to hold back the tide of illegal activity. This industry is plagued by foreign criminal interests and bad actors, making it nearly impossible to rein in. We can't put a band-aid on a broken bone. Knowing what we know, it's time to let Oklahomans bring safety and sanity back to their neighborhoods. Send the marijuana issue back to the vote of the people and shut it down.

As I've spent time reflecting, there is one great challenge that will remain. To those of you in this chamber, and those yet to serve, I implore you to fight for One Oklahoma – for fairness, transparency and for state sovereignty. I'm proud of Oklahoma's heritage - from the Native Americans who lived on this land and those who participated in the Land Run, to statehood. We have an amazing history.

When Justice Gorsuch, in a 5-4 decision in July of 2020, decided that half of our state was a reservation, I became the first Governor who had to face this new challenge. In the wake of the McGirt decision, I have worked tirelessly to hold the line to keep One Oklahoma and protect the rights of every Oklahoman. We need to come together and protect the vision cast in 1907. We need to stop any effort to federalize half of our state. That's why it is so important that we elect men and women of integrity. I want to make a few truths abundantly clear.

- 1) All laws should apply equally to all Oklahomans. No exceptions. An Indian named Kevin Stitt shouldn't be treated differently than a single mom of a different race.
- 2) If you commit a crime in Oklahoma, you should be prosecuted by a duly elected Oklahoma district attorney, you should be tried in an Oklahoma court overseen by a duly elected Oklahoma judge, and you should be protected by the rights laid out in the Oklahoma constitution. Your race shouldn't call any of these factors into question.
- 3) If you live in Oklahoma, you drive on Oklahoma roads, you attend Oklahoma schools, and you vote in Oklahoma elections, you absolutely should not have different tax treatment than any other Oklahoman.

These things shouldn't be controversial. I challenge Oklahomans to elect people who are committed to these values and protect these simple truths. Game wardens shouldn't be afraid to ticket poachers. District Attorneys shouldn't be afraid to prosecute criminals.

Local sheriffs shouldn't be afraid to enforce the law. Many of us in this room have decried the DEI programs of the Biden administration, yet standby quietly when some say an Indian should be subject to a different set of laws. We either believe in equal rights for all, or we don't, and it's time to choose. This issue will continue to split our state, both literally and figuratively, unless we address it head on. It will be uncomfortable, and you're going to have to face down the state's largest political donors, but we must fight for One Oklahoma.

Every year, there are challenges to address and hurdles to clear, and we get to decide – are we going to meet the moment? I enter this session with more optimism than ever. So let's dream big.

We've proven to the world that Oklahoma is second to none – it's a state that promotes innovation, champions freedom, and creates opportunity for its people.

Oklahoma wasn't built by government planners or bureaucrats. Oklahoma was built by entrepreneurs, risk-takers and innovators who believe in free markets and the American Dream – that if you work hard, take risks and create value, you should be rewarded.

There is so much more to come for our state. Opportunities we couldn't even imagine 7 years ago are knocking on our door, asking to be a part of the turnaround here in Oklahoma. Let's pursue the well-being of Oklahomans instead of our own self-interest.

Ronald Reagan, prior to his political career, gave a speech called "A Time for Choosing". I'll challenge you to go home and read that speech. He concludes by saying, "You and I have a rendezvous with destiny. We'll preserve for our children this, the last best hope of man on earth, or we'll sentence them to take the last step into a thousand years of darkness.". He's reminding us that we have to teach our children that there is no such thing as equal outcomes, only opportunities.

The decisions we make in this building should not be made solely under the consideration of our next election or the leadership post we hope for next session. They should not be made in pursuit of favor with a lobbyist or a special interest group – or a job when you're done with your term of service. Every decision we make here must be in pursuit of the good of Oklahoma's future.

The turnaround started here in 2019. It's been an amazing journey. It's up to us to preserve the American Dream for the next generation. Our choices will take us to the next level or back to the struggles we've turned away from. We have a rendezvous with destiny. Let's grab it with the tenacity and grit that sets us apart as Oklahomans.

May God bless you and may God continue to bless the great state of Oklahoma.




