An Act relating to the Oklahoma Strategic Military Planning Commission; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5401, which relates to creation of the Commission; extending sunset date; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

**SB 985** – By Thompson, Bullard, Wingard, Gillespie and Hamilton of the Senate and Pfeiffer of the House.

An Act relating to agriculture; creating the Oklahoma Local Food for Schools program; specifying purpose for program; providing for promulgation of rules; creating the Oklahoma Local Food for Schools Revolving Fund; establishing fund procedure; providing source of funds; authorizing the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry to use certain funds; stating purpose of fund; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to probate procedure; amending 58 O.S. 2021, Section 162, which relates to appointment of agents by nonresident representatives; modifying residency requirement; updating statutory language; making language gender neutral; and providing an effective date.

**SB 1441** – By Hines of the Senate and West (Josh) of the House.

An Act relating to critical infrastructure; amending 3 O.S. 2021, Section 322, which relates to prohibited unmanned aircraft; imposing criminal liability for violations; and providing an effective date.
