SB 1226 – By Rader of the Senate and Tedford of the House.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Sections 10-103 and 10-106, which relate to accidents; expanding criteria by which a person must remain at scene or make notification of certain accident; making language gender neutral; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1239 – By Haste of the Senate and Miller of the House.

An Act relating to Service Oklahoma; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104, as last amended by Section 18, Chapter 330, O.S.L. 2025 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1104), which relates to apportionment; amending, merging, consolidating, and repealing multiple versions of statute; modifying termination date of certain apportionment; updating statutory language; repealing 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104, as last amended by Section 7, Chapter 171, O.S.L. 2025 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1104), which relates to apportionment; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1309 – By Jech of the Senate and Johns of the House.

An Act relating to roads and bridges; amending 69 O.S. 2021, Section 1521, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 460, O.S.L. 2025 (69 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1521), which relates to the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund; modifying certain apportionment for certain fiscal years; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 2132 – By Kern and Frix of the Senate and Gise of the House.

An Act relating to credit cards; amending 14A O.S. 2021, Section 2-211, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 410, O.S.L. 2025 (14A O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2-211), which relates to discounts inducing payment by cash, check, or similar means; increasing certain surcharge limit; and providing an effective date.
