MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 667, 1466, 1942** and **1989**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 667 – By Coleman of the Senate and Roe and Hays of the House.

An Act relating to chiropractors; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Sections 161.2, 161.3, 161.7, 161.8, and 161.9, which relate to the Oklahoma Chiropractic Practice Act; modifying definitions; requiring use of licensure portals; modifying certain licensing requirements; modifying requirements for notification of disapproval; updating statutory language; repealing 59 O.S. 2021, Section 161.12a, which relates to registration as chiropractic claims consultant; and providing an effective date.

SB 1466 – By Bergstrom of the Senate and Kendrix of the House.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 3040.5, which relates to the Advisory Committee on Midwifery; extending sunset date; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1942 – By Thompson, Gillespie, Grellner, Daniels and McIntosh of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to dental insurance claims; amending 36 O.S. 2021, Section 7301, which relates to dental plan fee regulation; modifying definition; and providing an effective date.

SB 1989 – By Nice of the Senate and Osburn of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma College Savings Plan; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3970.7, which relates to operation through use of accounts; expanding options for making contributions to accounts; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.
