## MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 1191, 1258, 1920, 1936** and **2143**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

**SB 1191** – By Daniels of the Senate and Bashore of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Energy Initiative Act; repealing 17 O.S. 2021, Section 802.3, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 31, O.S.L. 2024 (17 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 802.3), which relates to the Oklahoma Low Carbon Energy Initiative Board; and providing an effective date.

**SB 1258** – By Hines and Jett of the Senate and Olsen of the House.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1272, which relates to unlawful carry; authorizing certain transport of firearm on water vessel; defining term; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

**SB 1920** – By Reinhardt of the Senate and Tedford of the House.

An Act relating to motor vehicle insurance; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1111, as last amended by Section 42, Chapter 171, O.S.L. 2025 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1111), which relates to salvage; increasing certain percent damage required for title return; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

**SB 1936** – By Hall of the Senate and Caldwell (Trey) of the House.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending Section 14, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 20N), which relates to Class D1 offenses; adding certain offense; updating statutory references; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 264, which relates to false impersonation of peace officers; modifying elements of certain offense; creating felony offenses and providing penalties; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1738, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 133, O.S.L. 2023 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1738), which relates to seizure and forfeiture proceedings; broadening scope of allowable seizure; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

**SB 2143** – By Alvord of the Senate and Lepak of the House.

An Act relating to ad valorem tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Sections 2802 and 2821, which relate to definitions and physical inspection of real property; modifying definition; defining term; authorizing the use digital visual technology for inspection of real property; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.
