MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 1216, 1589, 1597, 1641, 1642** and **2065**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 1216 – By Rader of the Senate and Harris of the House.

An Act relating to drug courts; amending 22 O.S. 2021, Section 471.2, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 277, O.S.L. 2022 (22 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 471.2), which relates to eligibility for drug court; modifying eligibility requirements; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1589 – By Gollihare of the Senate and Fetgatter of the House.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 941, as amended by Section 226, Chapter 486, O.S.L. 2025 (21 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 941), which relates to gambling; defining terms; modifying scope of certain offense; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 1597 – By Gollihare, Jett, Murdock, Coleman and Pederson of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Children's Code; amending 10A O.S. 2021, Section 1-8-102, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 310, O.S.L. 2022 (10A O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1-8-102), which relates to court-appointed special advocates; removing requirement for state association to adhere to certain national standards; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1641 – By Daniels of the Senate and Strom of the House.

An Act relating to business entities; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Sections 2005, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 121, O.S.L. 2024, 2043, and 2055.2, as amended by Section 21, Chapter 121, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 2005 and 2055.2) which relate to the Oklahoma Limited Liability Company Act; requiring submission of electronic mail address of certain agents or entities to the Secretary of State; amending 54 O.S. 2021, Sections 500-201A, 500-210A, and 500-902A, which relate to the Uniform Limited Partnership Act of 2010; requiring submission of electronic mail address of certain agents or entities to the Secretary of State; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1642 – By Frix of the Senate and Marti of the House.

An Act relating to controlled dangerous substances; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-309I, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 257, O.S.L. 2022 (63 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2-309I), which relates to prescription limits and rules for opioid drugs; authorizing divided quantities for certain acute pain prescriptions; updating statutory language; modifying statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 2065 – By Bullard of the Senate and Eaves of the House.

An Act relating to state symbols; creating the Lucile Morehouse Pollinator Act; providing short title; designating the European honeybee as the state agricultural pollinator; designating the American bumblebee as the state native insect; designating the Carolina mantis as the state predator insect; designating the rainbow scarab as the state soil conservation insect; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.
