Announcing the passage of **SBs 933, 1224, 1246, 1280, 1303, 1346, 1362, 1377, 1403, 1439, 1448, 1489, 1546, 1557, 1614, 1630, 1632, 1633, 1796, 1824, 1849, 1990, 2066 and 2071**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 933 – By Stanley of the Senate and Stark of the House.

An Act relating to health care; creating the Right to Try for Individualized Treatments Act; providing short title; defining terms; authorizing individualized investigational treatments for eligible patients; making act voluntary for manufacturers; providing certain authorities to eligible facilities; limiting effect of act; making coverage voluntary for payors; granting certain immunities from civil liability; granting certain protections to health care providers; prohibiting certain acts by state entities; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1224 – By Jech of the Senate and Duel of the House.

An Act relating to pardons and paroles; amending 57 O.S. 2021, Section 332.2, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 198, O.S.L. 2022 (57 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 332.2), which relates to pardon and parole procedures; authorizing electronic notification to victims and victim representatives; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1246 – By Rader of the Senate and Pfeiffer of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Environmental Quality Code; amending 27A O.S. 2021, Sections 2-14-103, 2-14-301, 2-14-302, 2-14-303, and 2-14-304, which relate to the Oklahoma Uniform Environmental Permitting Act; modifying definitions; modifying requirements and procedures for certain notifications; requiring certain information be made available online; modifying time frame for which certain meetings are held; modifying time frame for which certain response is prepared; modifying provisions for certain administrative hearing; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 1280 – By Bergstrom of the Senate and Kendrix of the House.

An Act relating to excise tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Sections 1101, 1102, and 1103, which relate to the additional tax on oil and gas; extending sunset of tax rate and apportionment; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1303 – By Daniels of the Senate and Lepak of the House.

An Act relating to workers' compensation; amending 85A O.S. 2021, Section 124, which relates to transfers from Workers' Compensation Court; transferring certain property and records; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; repealing 85A O.S. 2021, Section 121, which relates to the Advisory Council on Workers' Compensation; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1346 – By Woods of the Senate and Newton of the House.

[water and water rights - Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Investment Program - rule promulgation - priority scoring - clawback - publication - codification - noncodification - effective date - emergency]

SB 1362 – By Kirt, Boren and Paxton of the Senate and Osburn of the House.

An Act relating to in-person absentee voting; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 14-115.4, which relates to in-person absentee ballots; modifying time for in-person absentee

voting; modifying elections eligible for in-person absentee voting; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1377 – By Hall, Hicks and Nice of the Senate and Kane and Hill of the House.

An Act relating to foster care; requiring and authorizing the Department of Human Services to provide certain items to specified foster children; authorizing promulgation of rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1403 – By Rader of the Senate and Pae of the House.

An Act relating to incentives; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Sections 3604, as last amended by Section 157, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024, 3604.1, 3606, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 29, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2023, 3905, 3914, and 3915 (68 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 3604 and 3606), which relate to quality jobs incentives; modifying wage requirement; modifying period for filing a claim for rebate; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 1439 – By Daniels and Thompson of the Senate and Moore and Archer of the House.

An Act relating to oil and gas; creating the Energy Security and Independence Act; providing short title; providing legislative purpose; defining terms; prohibiting covered civil liability actions; construing provisions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1448 – By Gollihare of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Consumer Protection Act; amending 15 O.S. 2021, Section 754, which relates to exemptions; modifying exemptions; and providing an effective date.

SB 1489 – By Pugh of the Senate and Caldwell (Chad) of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-189, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 92, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 6-189), which relates to certification requirements for superintendent and principal; adding requirement for principal certification to include certain professional education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 13-101, which relates to services for children with disabilities; directing the State Department of Education and public school districts to comply with certain act; authorizing the Department to expend certain funds; modifying definition; providing certain rights to parents and legal guardians of children with disabilities; directing the Department to publish certain information on its website; allowing the State Board of Education to promulgate rules and update certain policies and procedures; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1546 – By Pugh of the Senate and Caldwell (Chad) of the House.

SB 1557 – By Rosino of the Senate and Newton of the House.

An Act relating to applied behavior analysis; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1928, which relates to licensing of behavior analysts; modifying definitions; transferring certain powers and duties from the Department of Human Services to the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists; granting certain additional power to the Board; requiring a national criminal history record check for applicants; prohibiting certain dissemination of information; updating statutory language and references; modifying certain fee limit; and providing an effective date.

SB 1614 – By Seifried of the Senate and Caldwell (Chad) of the House.

An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-122.3, as last amended by Section 162, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 6-122.3), which relates to requirements for alternative teaching certification; modifying requirements for adjunct teachers; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1630 – By Thompson of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1-109, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 480, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1-109), which relates to the length of the school year; allowing a school district or charter school to count certain day or number of hours toward certain requirement under certain circumstances; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1632 – By Alvord of the Senate and Hasenbeck of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 14-135, which relates to career-readiness assessments; directing the State Department of Education, rather than the Oklahoma Department of Commerce, in certain cooperation to approve certain assessments and credentials; removing language making such approval subject to funding; directing the assessments to be made available to students in certain grades beginning in certain school year; directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education in certain consultation to promulgate certain rules; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1633 – By Stanley, Woods and Hamilton of the Senate and Maynard of the House.

An Act relating to higher education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3242, which relates to resident tuition eligibility for students with certain status; removing language providing eligibility for students who cannot present certain documentation; removing language regarding eligibility for certain scholarships or financial aid for certain students; removing outdated language; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3242.2, which relates to higher education benefits for certain students; removing exception to prohibition for certain students; removing outdated language; updating statutory language; providing for promulgation of rules; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1796 – By Rosino of the Senate and Lawson of the House.

An Act relating to foster care; defining terms; allowing foster parents to use certain caregivers and arrangements for temporary care of foster children; specifying certain time limit on temporary care; requiring certain notice; requiring foster parents to identify certain formal alternate caregiver; specifying requirements for alternate caregivers; requiring certain screenings and home evaluation for alternate caregivers; authorizing respite care by certain foster families; providing for qualifications; authorizing certain informal care arrangements; requiring application of certain parenting standard; prohibiting use of certain informal caregivers; directing promulgation of rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1824 – By Reinhardt of the Senate and Duel of the House.

An Act relating to business entities; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1001, which relates to the Oklahoma General Corporation Act; updating statutory references; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1016, which relates to powers; clarifying powers under the Oklahoma General Corporation Act; authorizing certain contracts with one or more current or prospective shareholders or beneficial owners of stock; limiting contracting power under certain circumstances; providing effect of certain contract terms; permitting submission of matters to shareholder vote; authorizing board of directors to approve certain instruments in

final or substantially final form; permitting resolution ratifying instruments; providing for effect of ratification; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1030, which relates to interested parties and controlling shareholder transactions; clarifying validity of acts or transactions between certain interested parties; providing for validity of acts or transaction by controlling shareholders; creating liability for controlling shareholder or member for breach of fiduciary duty under certain circumstances; clarifying effect of validity of acts or transactions; defining terms; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1033, as amended by Section 18, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1033), which relates to issuance of stock; clarifying amount of minimum consideration; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1034, as amended by Section 19, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1034), which relates to consideration for stock; providing constitutional citation; permitting certain consideration for treasury shares; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1038, as amended by Section 20, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1038), which relates to rights and options respecting stock; clarifying when rights and options may be issued; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1041, as amended by Section 21, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1041), which relates to a corporation's powers; clarifying corporation's ability to resell; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1055.1, which relates to ratification; changing record date to adoption of resolution; updating requirements for certificate of validation; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1065, which relates to inspection of books and records; modifying definitions; requiring certain conditions for a shareholder to inspect and copy books and records; permitting corporation to impose reasonable restrictions; authorizing redaction of books and records; limiting court order production of certain books and records; permitting court-ordered production of additional records under certain conditions; authorizing district court to impose reasonable restrictions; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1073, as amended by Section 28, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1073), which relates to consent of shareholders; requiring prompt notice of the taking of action by consent when less than unanimous consent; permitting certain electronic notice; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1075.2, as amended by Section 29, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1075.2), which relates to notice; clarifying effect of certain notice; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1077, which relates to amendment of certificate of incorporation; modifying outstanding shares to issued shares; clarifying when a meeting or vote for adoption of certain amendments is not required; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Sections 1089 and 1090, which relate to merger, consolidation, and conversion; clarifying actions permitted in order to effect merger, consolidation, or conversion; permitting penalties or consequences provided in certain agreements; authorizing corporation to enforce payment obligations under certain agreements; providing for appointment of representatives; permitting certain agreements to be made depending upon certain facts; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1090.4, as amended by Section 31, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1090.4), which relates to conversion of an entity to a domestic corporation; providing for effective date of certificate of conversion; permitting certain contents in a plan of conversion; authorizing certain corporate action in approved plan of conversion; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 1090.5, as amended by Section 32, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1090.5), which relates to conversion of domestic corporation to an entity; requiring a plan of conversion be adopted with resolution approving conversion; permitting certain contents in a plan of conversion; providing for amendments to certificate of incorporation of surviving corporation after agreement of merger; excluding certain disclosure documents from merger agreement unless otherwise provided in agreement; amending 18 O.S. 2021,

Section 1093, which relates to mortgage or pledge of assets; permitting certain sale, lease, or exchange of property or assets without resolution under certain circumstances; excluding certain sale, lease, or exchange of property or assets from certificate of incorporation requirements; amending 18 O.S. 2021, Section 2001, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 121, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2001), which relates to Oklahoma Limited Liability Company Act definitions; updating statutory reference; amending Section 17, Chapter 121, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2054.8), which relates to merger and consolidation of registered series; permitting articles of merger or consolidation to amend and restate articles of registered series of the surviving registered series in its entirety; amending Section 18, Chapter 121, O.S.L. 2024 (18 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2054.9), which relates to division of limited liability company; permitting articles of division to amend and restate the articles of organization of the surviving company in its entirety; updating statutory references; making language gender neutral; updating statutory language; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1849 – By Gillespie of the Senate and Newton of the House.

An Act relating to the practice of podiatry; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 145.1, which relates to continuing education requirement; modifying certain license renewal requirements; updating statutory language; broadening allowed continuing education; providing certain exception; and providing an effective date.

SB 1990 – By Hall of the Senate and Kane of the House.

An Act relating to the Incentive Evaluation Commission; amending 62 O.S. 2021, Section 7005, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 125, O.S.L. 2023 (62 O.S.
