SB 1670 – By Reinhardt of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to higher education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3206.3, which relates to research and development at institutions of higher education; directing certain policy established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to include certain tiered system of ownership and require certain compensation; adding area of encouragement for certain development; requiring certain policies to be reviewed with certain frequency; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1687 – By Hines of the Senate and Miller of the House.

An Act relating to driver licenses; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Sections 6-105, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2024, and 6-110, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 450, O.S.L. 2024 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 6-105 and 6-110), which relate to driver licenses; adding certain age requirement for qualification for certain license;

permitting certain persons to proctor certain examination; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 1975 – By McIntosh, Grellner and Jett of the Senate and Miller of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.704, as amended by Section 20, Chapter 323, O.S.L. 2023 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1210.704), which relates to advanced placement courses; requiring public school districts to make certain examinations available to certain students; requiring districts to post certain information about the examinations on their websites; directing certain online learning platform to be available to all students in the state; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
