MESSAGES FROM THE SENATE

Announcing the passage of **SBs 63, 137, 201, 346, 483, 514, 1189, 1217, 1221, 1272, 1325, 1339, 1344, 1360, 1380, 1437, 1491, 1552, 1579, and 1806**. The measures were introduced and read for the first time.

SB 63 – By Goodwin of the Senate and Johns of the House.

An Act relating to school district boards of education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 5-118, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 4, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 5-118), which relates to board of education meetings; removing language allowing certain stipend only for boards of education of certain size school districts; providing range of stipend amount for certain board of education members; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 137 – By Hamilton of the Senate and Wilk and Turner of the House.

An Act relating to the Department of Corrections; amending 57 O.S. 2021, Section 510.9, which relates to the Electronic Monitoring Program; modifying elements of program eligibility; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 201 – By Pugh of the Senate and Caldwell (Chad) of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending Section 1, Chapter 289, O.S.L. 2023, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 480, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 18-114.15), which relates to the minimum salary schedule for certified personnel; modifying salary schedule amounts beginning in certain school year; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 346 – By Bergstrom, Mann, Hamilton and Sacchieri of the Senate and Hays of the House.

An Act relating to school personnel; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-104, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 445, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 3-104), which relates to the powers and duties of the State Board of Education; allowing the Board to suspend or revoke certain license or certificate for conviction of certain misdemeanor; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 5-142, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 101, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 5-142), which relates to criminal history record checks for school employees; requiring certain affidavit to include certain attestation; requiring affidavit to include certain information; requiring certain prospective employer to contact certain prior employer to determine the validity of certain affidavit; creating misdemeanor offense; providing penalties; prohibiting a board of education from hiring certain teacher who fails to provide certain affidavit; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 483 – By Weaver of the Senate and Kerbs of the House.

An Act relating to county commissioners; authorizing county commissioners to create certain relocation assistance program; providing certain ineligibilities; requiring contact with certain persons; requiring certain attestation; clarifying certain liability; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 514 – By Bergstrom of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to alternative education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.568, which relates to a statewide system of alternative education programs; removing outdated language; directing certain statewide system to include certain designated schools; allowing

a school district to implement certain program using full-time virtual or blended instruction; subjecting certain charter schools and virtual charter schools to certain provisions; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1189 – By Pugh of the Senate and Lowe of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending Section 2, Chapter 281, O.S.L. 2023, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 408, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 5-148.2), which relates to the School Security Revolving Fund; removing expenditure limitation; requiring certain amount of funds to be allocated from the fund each fiscal year for three fiscal years beginning on certain date, subject to available funding; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1217 – By Daniels, Guthrie and Bullard of the Senate and Osburn of the House.

An Act relating to real estate brokers; prohibiting requirement for broker to enter into certain agreement to show certain real estate; allowing certain brokers to require certain associate to enter into certain agreement prior to certain action; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1221 – By Gillespie of the Senate and Wilk of the House.

An Act relating to driver licenses; requiring Service Oklahoma to enact certain license tracking system by or before certain date; requiring Service Oklahoma to enact certain expedited delivery of credentials by or before certain date; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1272 – By Hines and Goodwin of the Senate and Hasenbeck of the House.

An Act relating to higher education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2632, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 129, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2632), which relates to eligibility for an Oklahoma Tuition Equalization Grant; increasing income eligibility; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1325 – By Coleman of the Senate and Hasenbeck and Hefner of the House.

[Protection from Domestic Abuse Act - victim protective orders - Global Positioning System (GPS) device - costs - monitoring - effective date]

SB 1339 – By Pugh and Pederson of the Senate and Lowe of the House.

An Act relating to schools; amending Section 1, Chapter 289, O.S.L. 2023, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 480, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 18-114.15), which relates to the minimum salary schedule for certified personnel; directing certain funds to be allocated by the State Board of Education to certain school districts for salary increases implemented in certain school year; directing funds to be allocated by certain date annually; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1344 – By Rosino, Mann and Hicks of the Senate and Stinson of the House.

An Act relating to prescription drugs; creating the Insulin Access and Affordability Program for specified purposes; directing the State Department of Health to provide certain financial support; requiring certain agreement with nonprofit pharmaceutical manufacturer; describing agreement; requiring certain annual reporting; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1360 – By Seifried of the Senate and Moore of the House.

An Act relating to mathematics instruction; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1210.508, as last amended by Section 10, Chapter 492, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 1210.508), which relates to the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act; modifying date by

which certain report is to be submitted; amending Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, and 8, Chapter 492, O.S.L. 2025 (70 O.S. Supp. 2025, Sections 1210.900, 1210.901, 1210.902, 1210.903, and 1210.907), which relate to the Oklahoma Math Achievement and Proficiency Act; directing certain teachers to have access to certain training; creating the Office of Mathematics Improvement within the State Department of Education within certain time period; providing for appointment of Director; providing qualifications for and duties of Director; directing the State Board of Education to approve certain number of screening instruments beginning in certain school year; requiring instruments to be chosen from certain list; directing the Office of Mathematics Improvement to approve and publish a list of certain professional development programs and providers; removing language requiring the Department to provide certain list of qualified entities; modifying school year in which certain students are to begin being screened for dyscalculia; allowing school districts to administer certain screening tool prior to certain school year; modifying date by which the State Board of Education is to develop certain policies; requiring development in certain consultation; requiring the Board to adopt a list of certain screening tools based on certain recommendations; modifying date by which public school districts and the Department are to begin reporting certain data; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1380 – By Stewart of the Senate and Stinson of the House.

An Act relating to the state Medicaid program; amending 56 O.S. 2021, Sections 246 and 247, which relate to verification of Medicaid eligibility; updating statutory language; requiring certain death record verifications; requiring certain denial or disenrollment of deceased individuals; prohibiting certain coverage or payments on behalf of deceased individuals; directing certain recoupment of funds; requiring certain periodic reviews by the State Auditor and Inspector; and providing an effective date.

SB 1437 – By Pugh and Hamilton of the Senate and Sterling and Stinson of the House.

An Act relating to schools; creating the President Donald J. Trump Physical Fitness Act; providing short title; directing the State Department of Education to establish certain guidelines to administer certain physical fitness test; directing guidelines to be based on certain recommendations; providing for contents of guidelines; requiring school districts to administer certain test after certain guidelines have been established; directing school districts to use student performance results in certain manner; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1491 – By Paxton of the Senate and Hilbert of the House.

An Act relating to Presidential Electors; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 10-108, which relates to vacancies; updating statutory language; prescribing oath for Electors filling vacancies; and providing an effective date.

SB 1552 – By Kirt and Daniels of the Senate and Kannady of the House.

An Act relating to counties; amending 19 O.S. 2021, Section 8.2, which relates to the authority to adopt or amend county home rule charter; providing for increasing population threshold for adopting or amending county home rule charter; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1579 – By Paxton of the Senate and Hilbert of the House.

An Act relating to ad valorem tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2876, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 105, O.S.L. 2025 (68 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2876), which relates to notice of increase of property valuation and protest; requiring certain notice

of valuation increase to include taxpayer bill of rights; prescribing language to be included in taxpayer bill of rights; and providing an effective date.

SB 1806 – By Paxton, Nice and Goodwin of the Senate and Lawson of the House.
[foster care - foster care services - qualifications - rules - funding - Oklahoma Adoption Code - applicability - benefits - construction - codification - effective date - emergency]

"SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2021, Section 402, is amended to read as follows:

Section 402. There shall be levied, assessed, collected and paid in respect to the articles containing tobacco enumerated in Section 401 et seq. of this title, a tax in the following amounts:

1. Little Cigars. Upon cigars of all descriptions made of tobacco, or any substitute therefor, and weighing not more than three (3) pounds per thousand, the tax levied on the products coming under this paragraph shall be equal to the tax on such products that is reported and paid as cigarette tax under Sections 301 through 325 of this title. Further, the tax levied herein shall be paid in the same manner as required in Sections 301 through 325 of this title;

2. Cigars. Upon cigars of all descriptions made of tobacco, or any substitute therefor, weighing more than three (3) pounds per thousand and having a manufacturer's recommended retail selling price, under the Federal Code, of not exceeding four cents (\$0.04) per cigar, one cent (\$0.01) for each cigar;

3. Cigars. Upon all other cigars of all descriptions made of tobacco, or any substitute therefor, and weighing more than three (3) pounds per thousand, Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per thousand. For the purpose of computing the tax, cheroots, stogies, etc., are hereby classed as cigars;

4. Smoking Tobacco. Upon all smoking tobacco, the tax shall be twenty-five percent (25%) of the factory list price exclusive of any trade discount, special discount or deals; and

5. Smokeless Tobacco. Upon smokeless tobacco, the tax shall be ~~twenty percent (20%) of the factory list price exclusive of any trade discount, special discount or deals~~ One Dollar and Seventy-two Cents (\$1.72) per ounce and a proportionate tax at the same rate on all fractional parts of an ounce thereof. The tax on smokeless tobacco shall be imposed based on the net weight of the product as listed by the manufacturer.

It shall not be permissible for a retailer to advertise that the retailer will absorb the tax due on the taxable merchandise described herein. Such tax shall be paid by the consumer.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the tax levied pursuant to the provisions of Section 401 et seq. of this title shall be part of the gross proceeds or gross receipts from the sale of tobacco products, or both, as those terms are defined in paragraph 12 of Section 1352 of this title.

SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2021, Section 402-1, is amended to read as follows:

Section 402-1. In addition to the tax levied by Section 402 of this title, there is hereby levied upon the sale, use, exchange or possession of articles containing tobacco as defined in Section 402 of this title, a tax in the following amounts:

1. Upon cigars of all descriptions made of tobacco, or any substitute therefor, and weighing more than three (3) pounds per thousand, and having a manufacturer's recommended retail selling price, under the Federal Code, of more than four cents (\$0.04)

for each cigar, Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per thousand. For the purpose of computing the tax, cheroots, stogies, etc., are hereby classed as cigars; and

2. Upon all smoking tobacco, the tax shall be fifteen percent (15%) of the factory list price exclusive of any trade discount, special discount or deals; ~~and~~

~~3. Upon smokeless tobacco, the tax shall be ten percent (10%) of the factory list price exclusive of any trade discount, special discount or deals.~~

This tax shall be paid by the consumer and no retailer may advertise that he will pay or absorb this tax.

The tax herein levied on tobacco products shall be collected on the same basis and in the same manner and in all respects as the tax levied by the Tobacco Products Tax Law. The revenue from this additional tax shall be apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax Commission in the same manner as provided in Section 404 of this title, for the apportionment of other tobacco products tax revenue.

SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2021, Section 402-3, is amended to read as follows:

Section 402-3. A. In addition to the tax levied in Sections 402 and 402-1 of this title, effective January 1, 2005, there shall be levied, assessed, collected, and paid in respect to the articles containing tobacco enumerated in Section 401 et seq. of this title, a tax in the following amounts:

1. Cigars. Upon all cigars of all descriptions made of tobacco, or any substitute therefor, and weighing more than three (3) pounds per thousand, Ninety Dollars (\$90.00) per thousand. For the purpose of computing the tax, cheroots, stogies, etc., are hereby classed as cigars; and

2. Smoking Tobacco. Upon all smoking tobacco, the tax shall be forty percent (40%) of the factory list price exclusive of any trade discount, special discount or deals; ~~and~~

~~3. Smokeless Tobacco. Upon smokeless tobacco, the tax shall be thirty percent (30%) of the factory list price exclusive of any trade discount, special discount or deals.~~

B. Except as provided in subsection C of this section, the revenue resulting from the additional tax levied in subsection A of this section shall be apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax Commission and transmitted to the State Treasurer as follows:

1. Twenty-two and six-hundredths percent (22.06%) shall be placed to the credit of the Health Employee and Economy Improvement Act Revolving Fund created in Section 1010.1 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

2. Three and nine-hundredths percent (3.09%) shall be placed to the credit of the Comprehensive Cancer Center Debt Service Revolving Fund created in Section 160.1 of Title 62 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

3. Before July 1, 2008, seven and fifty-hundredths percent (7.50%) shall be placed to the credit of the Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund created in Section 1-2530.9 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes. On and after July 1, 2008, seven and fifty-hundredths percent (7.50%) shall be allocated as follows:

For fiscal years beginning July 1, 2006, and thereafter, the apportionment percentage specified in paragraph 12 of this subsection will be adjusted by dividing the total municipal and county sales tax revenue collected in the calendar year immediately preceding the commencement of the fiscal year by the sum of the state sales tax revenue and total municipal and county sales tax revenue collected in the same year. This ratio shall be divided by the ratio of the total municipal and county sales tax revenue collected in the calendar year beginning January 1, 2004, and ending December 31, 2004, divided by the sum of the state sales tax revenue and total municipal and county sales tax revenue collected in the same year. - c. any additional revenue allocated pursuant to this paragraph shall be placed to the credit of the Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund;

8. One percent (1%) shall be placed to the credit of the Tobacco Prevention and Cessation Revolving Fund created in Section 1-105d of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

months after commercial operation, said retail electric supplier shall pay a penalty of 1% of sales to that electric consuming facility per annum to the incumbent retail electric supplier until such time as it does reach 1,000 kw. The penalty may not be recovered directly from ratepayers or members, and shall be paid from the profits or margins of the utility making the payments. The Corporation Commission shall enforce this penalty upon application of an interested party and may waive the penalty upon a finding that the utility serving said load was not at fault in serving said load which did not reach 1,000 kw for reasons unforeseen when service was extended. This section shall not apply to any such load served before August 26, 2026.", which amendment was declared adopted.
