The House was called to order by Representative Pae.

RESOLUTION FOR CONSIDERATION

HR 1047 was called up for consideration.

Representative Sneed moved to amend **HR 1047**, Page 3, Lines 20 through 24 by deleting the following clause: "THAT CompSource Mutual Insurance Company shall not be considered a state agency, public body, department, or any other term used to describe an entity which is part of the Executive Branch of the State of Oklahoma under any state statute or regulation, except as otherwise provided for in this act.", which amendment was declared adopted.

Upon motion of Representative Sneed, **HR 1047** was considered and adopted.

HR 1047 was referred for enrollment.

Transmitting engrossed measure

As approved by the Joint Committee on Appropriations and Budget, advising passage and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **SB 1177**. The measure was introduced and read for the first time.

SB 1177 – By Hall and Haste of the Senate and Caldwell (Trey) and Kane of the House.
