Forty-sixth Legislative Day, Thursday, April 23, 2026

The House was called to order by Representative Maynard.

The roll was called with 73 Members present.

Announcing the passage of **SCR 22**. The measure was introduced and read.

SCR 22 – By Nice of the Senate and Hefner of the House.

A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the impact of light pollution on bird mortality; and encouraging Oklahoma businesses, state agencies, organizations, and residents to turn off any exterior lighting during the high migration intensity months of April, May, September and October.
