In accordance with Article VI, Section 11, of the Oklahoma Constitution, Enrolled **HB 3279** has become law without the Governor's signature and has been filed with the Oklahoma Secretary of State on May 5, 2026.

Advising of his approval of **HBs 1590, 3043, 3143, 3321, 3464 and 3499** on May 5, 2026.

Advising of his veto of **HB 3078** on May 5, 2026. The veto message reads as follows:

Pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution, I have vetoed Enrolled House Bill **3078**.

This bill would require all executive agencies, boards, and commissions to include a donation prompt for the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs on forms used in the course of state business. That would include driver license applications, motor vehicle registrations, hunting and fishing license applications, income tax forms, and other forms used to process licenses and essential services.

Official state forms used to conduct government business are not the place to solicit donations. Many state agencies perform important work, and many public causes are worthy of support. Once official state forms are used this way, every worthy cause will have reason to ask for the same treatment. That would turn routine government forms into fundraising tools, distracting from their purpose and creating unnecessary pressure on citizens simply trying to access basic state services.

I strongly encourage Oklahomans to continue to support veterans through dedicated programs, responsible funding, and donations to their preferred veteran non-profits. Oklahoma state forms should remain focused on the government function they are meant to perform, not become fundraising tools to reinforce government services.

For these reasons, I have vetoed Enrolled House Bill **3078**.

**Memorandum of Understanding**  
**Between**  
**The Town of Wellston, a municipal corporation,**  
**&**  
**The Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma**  
**Providing for Cross Deputization of Law Enforcement Officers**

This memorandum of understanding (MOU) is entered into by and between the Town of Wellston, Oklahoma, a municipal corporation, by Mayor Brandon Hunt and the Town Board of Trustees (hereinafter referred to as "Town"), and the Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma by the Chairman of the Tribe, Jacob Keyes (hereinafter referred to as the "Iowa Tribe"). Nothing in this MOU should be construed as limiting or impeding the basic spirit of cooperation which currently exists between the Town and the Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma.

**Article I – Purpose and Authority**

The purpose of this MOU is to provide for the cross-commission of law enforcement officers employed by the Town and Iowa Tribe, so that the law enforcement officers of these parties will be authorized to provide law enforcement services and make lawful arrests in geographic boundaries of the Iowa Tribe and the Town of Wellston, OK.

This MOU establishes, delineates, and formalizes the relationship between and among the Town of Wellston and the Iowa Tribe to foster an efficient and effective police force capable of protecting the combined citizens of the parties. It is the desire of the parties to achieve maximum cooperation in a combined law enforcement effort aimed at reducing crime in areas under the combined jurisdiction of the parties.

All parties to this MOU shall cooperate with each other to provide comprehensive and thorough law enforcement protection, including but not limited to effecting arrests, responding to calls for assistance from all citizens and from other law enforcement officers, performing investigations and providing other assistance as deemed necessary by the parties.

This MOU is authorized by the parties under the formal action of the Town Board of Trustees of the Town of Wellston, Oklahoma at its General Board Meeting on March 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2026, and Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma Resolution Number 1-26-59.

**Article II – Definitions**

Definitions the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

GREY SNOW POLICE DEPARTMENT shall mean the police department of the Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma.

IOWA TRIBE shall mean the Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma

IOWA TRIBE BUSINESS COMMITTEE shall mean the governing body of the Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma.

INDIAN COUNTRY shall mean the geographical areas defined by 18 U.S.C. Section 1151 and under the authority of the Iowa Tribe.

MOU shall mean this Memorandum of Understanding between the Iowa Tribe and the Town of Wellston, Oklahoma.

WELLSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT shall mean the police department of the Town of Wellston, Oklahoma.

TOWN OF WELLSTON, OKLAHOMA shall mean a municipal corporation located within Lincoln County.

WELLSTON TOWN BOARD OF TRUSTEES shall mean the governing body of the Town of Wellston, Oklahoma.

WELLSTON CORPORATE LIMITS shall mean the corporate limits of the Town of Wellston, Oklahoma.

### **Article III – Cross Commission Agreement**

#### **A. GREY SNOW POLICE DEPARTMENT**

Any duly authorized and qualified law enforcement officer of the Grey Snow Police Department may be given special law enforcement status by the Town of Wellston, Oklahoma. Said cross commission shall authorize and empower the law enforcement officer of Grey Snow Police Department to enforce federal, state, and local laws within the Wellston Corporate Limits. Any person arrested by the Grey Snow Police Department within the Wellston Corporate Limits shall be processed for prosecution in either Wellston Municipal Court or in Lincoln County District Court, depending on the nature of the crime and appropriate judicial forum.

#### **B. WELLSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT**

Any duly authorized and qualified law enforcement officer of the Wellston Police Department may be given special law enforcement status by the Iowa Tribe. Said cross commission shall authorize and empower the officers of the Wellston Police Department to enforce the laws of the United States and Iowa Tribe in Indian Country. Any Indians arrested by the Wellston Police Department within Indian Country shall be processed for prosecution in either the Iowa Tribe Court or in a federal court, depending on the nature of the crime and appropriate judicial system.

#### **C. AID AND ASSISTANCE**

The Wellston Town Board of Trustees and the Iowa Tribe Business Committee agree that their respective law enforcement officers will provide all aid and assistance possible to the law enforcement officers of the other party, including reinforcement or back-up assistance when requested and immediate response to crisis situations so that the nearest available law enforcement officer, whether from the Grey Snow Police Department or the Wellston Police Department, may respond as promptly as possible in situations where human life or property is endangered, regardless of primary jurisdiction. Such aid and assistance shall be freely requested and responded to in keeping with the intent of this MOU to better protect innocent lives and property, to better provide law enforcement services for all persons, and to apprehend violators of the law.

**Article IV - Jurisdiction**

The Wellston Town Board of Trustees and the Iowa Tribe Business Committee recognize that when law enforcement officers arrest a criminal suspect, the officers may not know whether the suspect or the victim is an Indian or whether the arrest or the suspected crime has occurred within Indian Country, or Wellston Corporate Limits, and therefore, there is a great difficulty in determining the proper jurisdiction for filing charges. The Wellston Town Board of Trustees and the Iowa Tribe Business Committee agree that the standard arresting procedure under this MOU will have the cross-commissioned arresting officer deliver any arrestee to the place of incarceration within the jurisdictional area where it is anticipated the charge will be filed, unless otherwise directed by an Assistant United States Attorney, the Lincoln County District Attorney or his/her designee, the Wellston Town Attorney, or the Iowa Tribe Prosecutor.

**Article V – Organization**

No separate legal or administrative entity is created hereby by either party entering this MOU.

**Article VI – Financing**

Law enforcement activities of each of the parties will be financed by the respective party except as expressly provided herein. Neither party agrees to provide financing or funding of law enforcement activities to the other party, except as expressly provided herein or as may be hereinafter granted.

**Article VII – Employees**

Each party agrees to be responsible for all employer obligations to their own employees regardless of whether the employee is working directly for the employer or in a cross-commission capacity. By way of example, not limitation, these obligations include, if applicable, salary, taxes, workers' compensation insurance, liability insurance, disability insurance, and retirement benefits. In no event shall a party be responsible for the other parties' obligations as an employer to their employee. This provision shall not apply to instances when the Iowa Tribe or a third party has hired officers of the Wellston Police Department in their individual capacities, to provide security or other services on Indian land. Notwithstanding any provision contained in this Article VII, all cross-commissioned officers shall have all protections afforded to them by federal law.

**Article VIII – Property**

No real or personal property is to be acquired or held under this MOU. When personal property is loaned from one party to another it shall be returned as soon as possible upon the request of the owner party.

**Article IX – Commissions**

- A. Each party to this MOU may, in its discretion, issue special law enforcement commissions to law enforcement officers of the other party to this MOU upon the application for such commission by the police department of the applying party. All officers of either party shall not become automatically cross-commissioned by virtue of the execution of this MOU but must be commissioned on an individual basis, upon application by each parties Police Chief and approval by the other parties Police Chief. Commission cards shall be issued by each department to the officers so commissioned and working for the other party. When a party issues such a commission, it shall provide notice of that commission, including the name of the officer receiving the commission, to the other party of this MOU. The cross-commissioned officer shall carry a cross-commission card issued by the Chief of Police of the other police department and shall carry always said card when performing cross-commissioned duties.
- B. A commission shall not be granted unless an officer has complied with all the prerequisites for appointment as a police officer of the commissioning party. Those prerequisites must include the following which shall be certified by the applicants Police Chief:
1. United States citizenship,
  2. High School diploma or equivalent
  3. No conviction for a felony or crime of moral turpitude or violent misdemeanor or active protective order where the officer is the defendant,
  4. A finding that the applicant is free of any physical, emotional, or mental condition which might adversely affect his/her performance as a police officer,
  5. and be a certified graduate of the CLEET Basic Police Academy or the United States Indian Police Academy.
- C. If required by the commissioning party, the applicants police department shall provide a background check and investigation that meets the standards of the governing commission.
- D. A commissioning party may, at any time, suspend or revoke a law enforcement officer's commission for any reason solely at its discretion. A commission party, may orally or in writing, notify the cross-commissioned officer that his/her commissions suspended or revoked, and such revocation or suspension shall be immediately effective. Within three (3) days after such notification to the subject officer's police department, the cross commissioned police department shall cause the commission card and any other evidence of the commission to be returned to the commissioning party.

**Article X – Scope of Powers Granted**

The parties agree that nothing in this MOU makes any law applicable to a person where it would not otherwise be applicable by law. Accordingly, the purpose of this MOU is to provide cross-commissioned officers with the authority to only enforce applicable law.

Nothing in this MOU alters or conveys any judicial jurisdiction, including the authority to issue warrants for arrest or search and seizure or to issue service of process. Similarly, nothing in this MOU is intended to impair, limit, or affect the status of any agency or the sovereignty of any government.

**Article XI – Disposition and Custody**

Any person arrested by a law enforcement officer commissioned pursuant to this MOU shall be turned over to a responsible official of the proper jurisdiction. In order to ascertain the proper jurisdiction, the officer shall ask the arrestee where practicable, whether he or she is an Indian or non-Indian and shall rely on the representation. Additionally, the arresting officer will also note the location of the arrest, and the location of the alleged criminal activity of the arrestee, which will be utilized to determine the proper jurisdiction for process of prosecution of the arrestee.

**Article XII – Detention, Transportation, and Travel Expenses**

After the initial detention pursuant to Article IV, all detention and transportation of prisoners, and all necessary transportation of prisoners for health care except local emergency care, shall be performed by the police department of the party who has jurisdiction over the prisoner.

**Article XIII – Supervision**

It is understood and agreed by the parties that the respective law enforcement departments, their agents, officers, employees, and insurers have no authority or any right whatsoever to control in any manner the day-to-day discharge of the duties of the respective law enforcement officers who have been commissioned pursuant to this MOU except as provided herein. The parties agree that when a cross-commissioned officer provides aid or assistance to the other party, the cross-commissioned officer will temporarily be under the general supervision of the ranking regular officer at the location of the aid or assistance or in near proximity of the location of the aid or assistance. The ranking officer of the party within whose territorial jurisdiction an incident has occurred shall have the responsibility to supervise and direct all law enforcement activities and crime scene investigation with due regard for the expertise of all law enforcement officers which may be present or otherwise involved. In the event two or more law enforcement officers of equivalent rank are on location of the incident, the officer whose territorial jurisdiction covers the location of the incident shall have the responsibility to supervise and direct the other law enforcement officers, and the other law enforcement officers shall have the duty to respond and comply with the supervising officer's commands.

**Article XIV – Liabilities and Immunities**

It is understood and agreed that each party to this MOU, its agents, employees, and insurers, do not, by virtue of this MOU, assume any responsibility for the actions of law

enforcement officers commissioned pursuant to the MOU which are performed outside the scope of their duties.

Nothing in this MOU shall be read as waiving or limiting any defenses to claims of liability otherwise available to law enforcement officers, such as the defense of qualified immunity.

Nothing in this MOU shall be construed as a waiver of any government's sovereign immunity, not otherwise expressly waived by legislative act.

#### **Article XV – Other Provisions**

The parties agree that they will cause their respective law enforcement officers to make and file reports and other documents with the appropriate officials of the other party when the law enforcement officer provided aid or assistance or was involved in a law enforcement matter within the territorial jurisdiction of the other party or such officer has knowledge of the facts to be reported concerning an incident which occurred within the territorial jurisdiction of the other party and such reports or documents are needed by the other party for the purpose of law enforcement record-keeping or prosecution of criminal offenders. The parties further agree that they will freely allow and cause their respective law enforcement officers to appear and give their testimony in the court of the other party for the prosecution of offenses to which the subject officer has knowledge.

Each party mutually agrees to provide the other party with notice of changes in their operational law enforcement policies, guidelines, and important changes in the criminal law of their respective jurisdictions to facilitate communication and prevent unnecessary misunderstanding between the law enforcement officers in the field. Further, the parties agree to notify each other of any in-house law enforcement training programs which are available for all cross-commissioned officers.

#### **Article XVI – Amendment, Modification, and Termination**

**Amendment and Modification.** This MOU may be modified or amended only by written, mutual agreement of the parties.

**Termination.** Either of the parties may terminate this MOU by providing written notice to the other party. The termination shall be effective upon the thirtieth (30) calendar day following notice to the other party unless a later date is set forth in the notice. In the event of termination, the parties shall continue to be responsible for all costs incurred by them under this MOU, and for the costs of closing out or transferring any on-going contracts associated with this MOU.

#### **Article XVII – Duration and Expiration**

This MOU shall expire one (1) year from the effective date as established in Article XXI. Therefore, this MOU shall be automatically renewed for successive one-year periods

commencing the anniversary of the effective date hereof unless prior to a renewal any party gives written notice to the other party that the MOU shall not be renewed as to the non-renewing party.

**Article XVIII – Media**

The parties agree that all media releases pertaining to arrests made by cross-commissioned law enforcement officers, or incidents involving law enforcement officers of both police departments, will be coordinated by the Police Chief of the parties, who shall follow their respective protocol regarding media releases. The press release shall be issued only by the jurisdictional Police Chief.


**Article XIX – Effective Date**



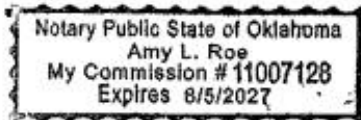
